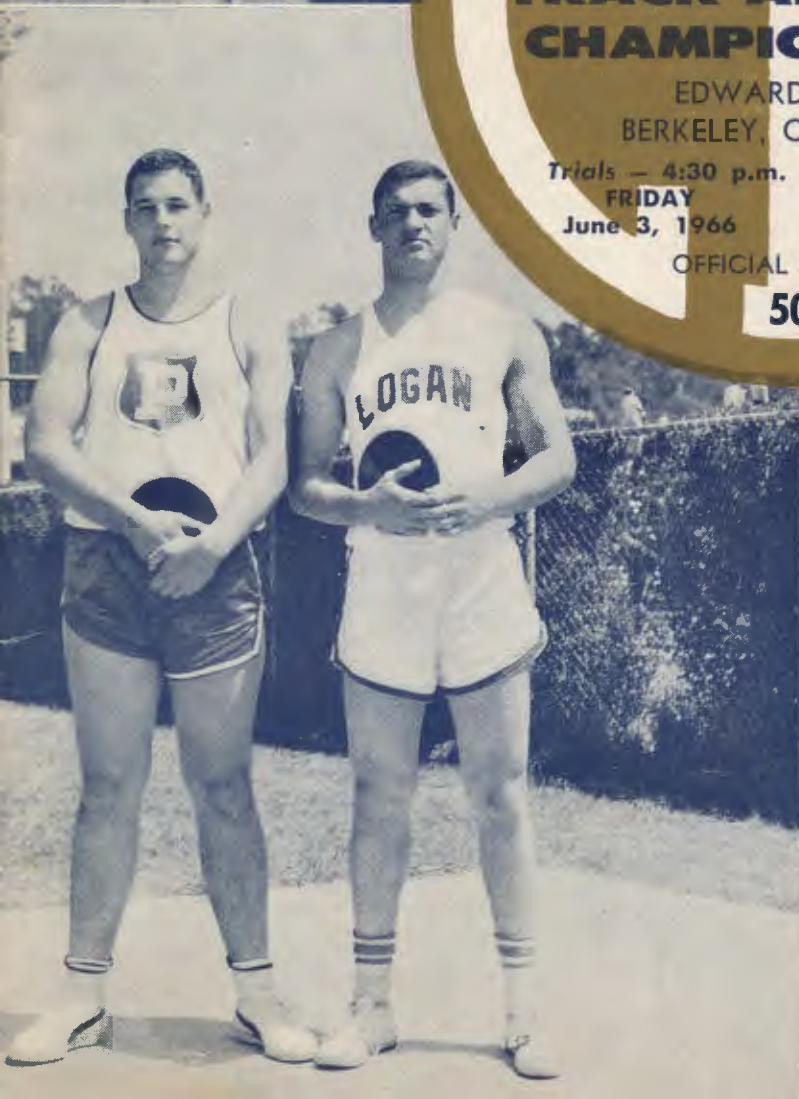

New Records in the Offing As Field of 364 Top Preps Compete for '66 Honors

ONE OF THE STRONGEST FIELDS in many years assembles on Edwards Field June 3 and 4 to vie for the important CIF State Championship in this forty-eighth—and biggest—of championships.

As usual, the major strength lies with the Southern California schools, where San Diego's Doyle Steele just a week ago set a new national prep record in the long jump, 25'5 $\frac{1}{4}$ "; Muir of Pasadena, in Paul Heglar, has a 16'3" pole vaulter; Long Beach Poly boasts of John Hubbell, 67'9 $\frac{3}{4}$ " in the shot put, more than three feet beyond the official CIF standard; Lincoln of Los Angeles, with Doug Huff jumping 6'9 $\frac{3}{4}$ ", threatens the national mark, also 6'9 $\frac{3}{4}$ " (but he'll run into some tough competition from three Northern California jumpers); four Southern California runners have bettered 1:53 in the half mile; last year's mile winner and defending champion, Tim Danielson of Chula Vista, broke the CIF standard (unofficially), posting 4:06.2 in the final trials; the accounting could go on indefinitely.

However, Northern California has some good ones, too. Three high jumpers, John Radetick, San Carlos, 6'9 $\frac{3}{4}$ "; Fred Jackson, Castlemont, 6'10 $\frac{1}{2}$ "; and Don Pierce, Pittsburg, 7'0" could even set a new national mark. Discus throwers Jim Peters, Piedmont, 188'8"; and Mike Louisiana, Logan, 186'5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", both could break the CIF mark of Bob Stoecker, set in 1961.

Some fine all-round athletes are Clarence Taylor, Richmond, who qualified for three events, 440, 220, and relay; LaMarr Haywood, Skyline, high hurdles and long jump; Mel Gray, Montgomery, Santa Rosa, 100, 220, long jump, and relay; and Marion Anderson, El Cerrito, long jump and high jump.

Ernie Provost, Washington of San Francisco sprinter who placed in both the 100 and 220 in the 1965 State Meet, is back again to try to improve his third place 100 time of 0:09.6 and second place 220 time of 0:21.2. He must be regarded as a real threat; after all, there is no Harold Busby this year!

Another Northern California standout is Ralph Gamez of Berkeley, two miler, 1965 defending champion, who has a stunning time of 9:05.2, set on this same field just a week ago. Indeed, in the two mile event, Northern California teams present their strongest entries.

Dennis Barley, DeAnza miler, must be given consideration for points as his 4:17.1 time in the North Coast Section final meet last Saturday would indicate.

Off qualifying marks, Lincoln of San Diego should be favored to take top honors, with nine athletes qualified in nine different events. Muir of Pasadena, with six qualifiers in seven events, including the top pole vaulter, a fine hurdler, and a fast relay team (1:27.6) might sneak in for the necessary points.

Pacific Grove's Johnny Johnson, for two years strong in the long jump, missed qualifying this year, his final one, because of a leg injury. He had hoped to exceed the CIF standard.

If the 1966 meet lacks anything in class, it is a fast sprint field, with no 100-yard man bettering 0:09.7, although two sprinters, Phil Underwood, Dorsey, and Jim Hill, Edison of Stockton, have posted like 0:21.0 times in the 220.

Long jump, high jump, mile, two-mile, discus, shot, and pole vault appear to be the events to watch for the records, with San Diego Lincoln the favorite for the team title.

Meet director Hale Roach, El Cerrito High School, hopes for a warm day and a large and enthusiastic crowd as California's finest athletes come to their "moments of truth."

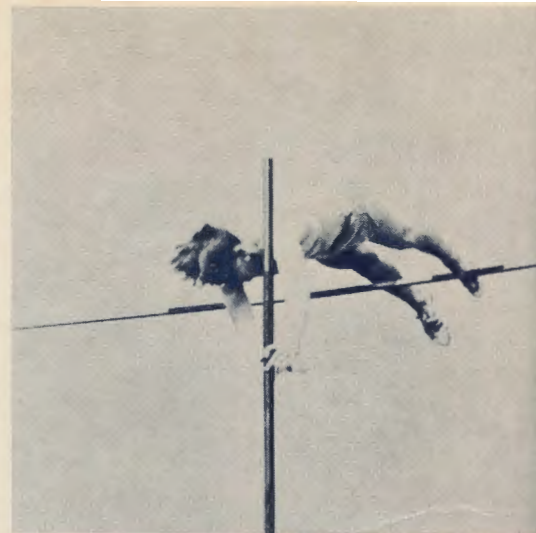

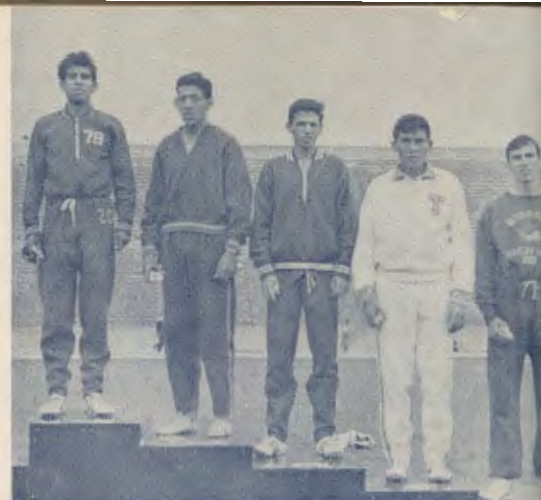

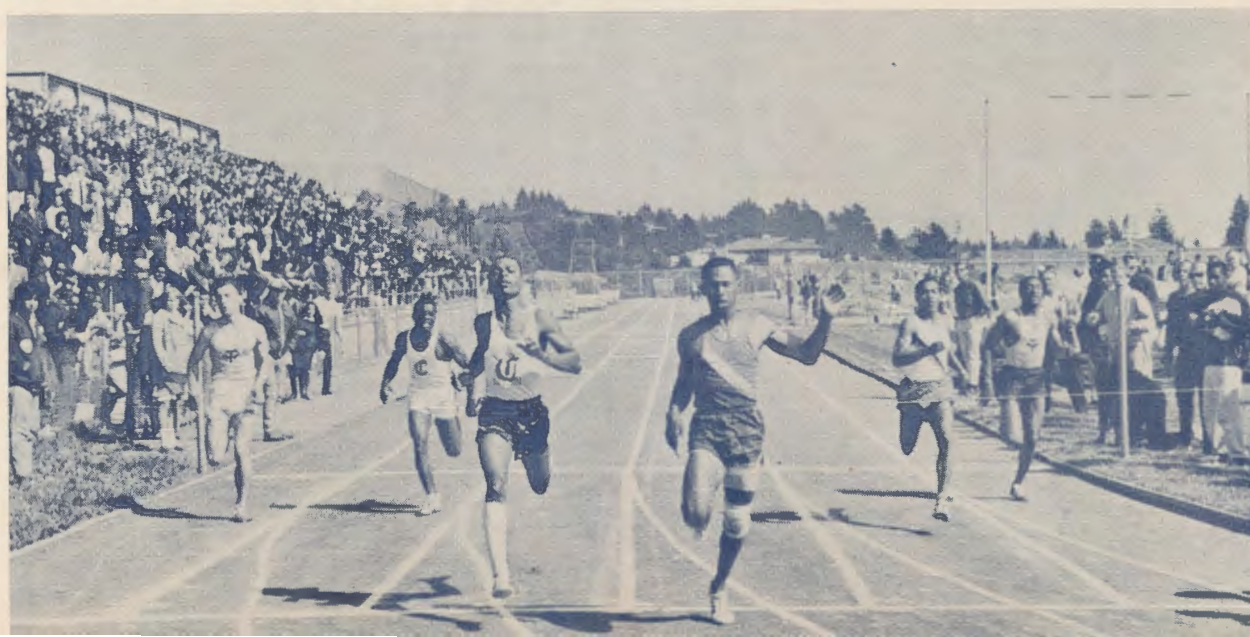
