Time for the South to 'Rise' Again In 51st Annual State Track Championships

Southern California stands to clean up the major portion of honors in the 51st Annual California State High School Track and Field Meet Championships at UCLA's new Track Stadium—and before a substantially partisan audience.

Los Angeles High's Romans are heavy favorites to win the team championship, with most of their competition expected to come from Washington (L.A.) High, which finished second to L.A. in the Los Angeles City finals last Saturday, and Compton High's Southern Section champions.

Coaches Ed Bravo and Charles Jackson of L.A. are counting most heavily on sprinters Albert Hearvey (9.4w, 9.5-21.2) and Ronnie Welch (9.6-21.2), pole vaulter Robert Pullard (16-7), half-miler James Baxter (1:51.0), and swift 440 (41.5) and mile (3:17.8) relay teams to project their bid for the school's first state title since 1920.

Pullard set a national interscholastic record last weekend (it was equalled the same day by Casey Carrigan of Orting, Wash.) and Baxter, a junior, cracked his own week-old city mark for the 880. It may take a 17-foot effort to win the vault, with defending state champ Steve Smith of South Torrance (16-4½) also back, and Baxter will have to approach 1:50.0 to win—possibly even the national record of 1:48.8 set by Rich Joyce of Sierra, Whittier, in 1965.

Hearvey and Welch could go 1-2 in the sprints, though the Southern Section has some fine entries in Santa Ana's Jackie White (9.5-21.7), El Centro's Willie Robinson (9.6), La Puente's Patrick Miles (9.6w), and Santa Ana Valley's Clyde Emery (9.7). Best from the north are Edison, Fresno's Garland Burks (9.6-21.3) and Pittsburg's Ralph Ligons (9.5w-21.7).

Whittier's Bill Sims (47.1) and Lemoore's Larance Jones (48.0, 46.8 relay) figure to have quite a 440 duel, with Long Beach Millikan's Bob Langston (48.8) also looming a strong contender. Jones was third last year. Langston has stretched from the 880 to concentrate on the 440. Sims, similarly, has pulled out of the 220 to give his all in the quarter.

Roosevelt, Fresno's John Banks (48.5) and Del Oro's Ed Bonner (48.2) are also top possibilities. Langston was third in the 880 in 1968.

Baxter is faced with Canoga Park's Ricco Sanchez (1:51.6), whom he has beaten their last two meets, Madison's Pat McCallion (1:54.2), Buena, Ventura's Mark Franek (1:54.2), Bishop Montgomery's Percell Keeling (1:54.3), and Manual Arts' James Couch (1:54.4) as 880 threats.

In the mile, Bolsa Grande junior Terry Lamb (4:10.4) goes against Lakewood's Bob Somesan (4:12.5), South Torrance's Decker Underwood (4:12.6), Channel Islands' Steve Hungerford (4:12.7), Burlingame's Eugenio Amaya (4:13.8), Fairfax's Dan Schechter (4:15.8), and Redondo's Art Manjarrez (4:13.6).

Berkeley's John Dean (4:15.7), Reseda's Mike Butler (4:15.2), and Palisades' Rich Tschudin (4:14.3) are three more outstanding milers.

The two-mile returns defending champion Ruben Chappins of Excelsior (9:00.8), third place Fred Ritcherson of Salesian (9:04.0), and fourth place Ruben Mejia of La Habra (9:04.8).

To challenge them are El Modena junior David White (9:01.4), West Torrance junior Ron Johnson (9:02.8), and Monte Vista's Dave Carter (9:10.4).

In the hurdles, Roosevelt, Fresno's Jerry Wilson (13.8w, 14.0-18.8) was second in both the highs and lows last year. His main competition should come from Washington, L.A.'s Charles Rich (13.6w, 13.9-18.6w, 18.8); San Juan's Dan Redfern (13.8-18.8), Pomona's Mark Low (14.1-18.6).

Compton's Zack Donaldson (14.1) and Lincoln, S.D.'s Marion Franklin (14.1) will be tough in the highs, too, while Gardena's Steve Holden (18.8), Lemoore's Jones (18.7), and Long Beach Poly's Bob Stockton (18.8) are in the lows only—and have impressive credentials.

The 440 relay features Dorsey (41.8), which defeat Los Angeles in the L.A. City meet, Centennial of Compton (42.1), San Diego Lincoln (41.6), and Edison, Fresno (42.0), plus L.A. (41.5).

For the mile relay, Centennial (3:16.7) is the team to beat, with Dorsey (3:17.4), Los Angeles (3:17.8), S.D. Lincoln (3:19.0), Washington, L.A. (3:18.5), et al., aiming to do just that.

Olympic "veteran" Reynaldo Brown of Compton, who set a meet record of 7 feet even last year and later jumped 7-3 in the pre-Olympic trials, is after that rarity, three consecutive state championships. Brown has gone "only" 6-10½ so far this spring, but the incentive of his best competition, to date, could inspire him to move up to the 7-foot mark.

Washington, L.A.'s Robert Joseph (6-9½), Oceanside junior Jerry Culp (6-7¾), Castlemont, Oakland's Sam Maxwell (6-9), and Hoover, Fresno's Rick Fletcher (6-8¾) supply the opposition.

After Smith and Pullard, the pole vault field has Rosemead's Dennis Gingrich (15-0¼), San Mateo's Jim Lydon (15-2), King City's Sam Albanese (15-0½), and Fremont's Russ Royal (15-0).

In the shot put, '68 third placer Sam Cunningham of Santa Barbara (64-9) seeks to defeat behemoth Kerry Eskeli of Serra, Gardena (64-8¾), Clovis' Al Delario (61-6), Lakewood's Steve Lauriano (61-11), and Modesto's Randy Rhynes (60-4).

The long jump could be led by Cathedral, L.A.'s Troy Lyons (24-1¼), Edison, Stockton's Prentice McCray (24-1½), Gardena's Holden (24-1), or Tulare's James Allen (24-2), who was overshadowed last year by state winner Heulon Hewitt of Merced. McCray was sixth in '68.

Porterville's Doyle Nelms (171-5) was fourth in the '68 discus and is up against Gunn's Tom Birthwhistle (195-4), Pacific's John Gledhill (189-1), Los Altos junior Chris Adams (183-11), and Hillsdale's Mike Davis (185-7).

Bryce Erwin Schurr



Bryce Erwin Schurr, an outstanding athlete, successful coach, and highly-respected administrator for the past four decades, is the Honorary Referee for the 1969 California State High School Track and Field Championship Meet.

Born in Hutchinson, Kan., Mr. Schurr was a star athlete in football and track at La Puente High School and placed fourth in the mile run in the 1925 State C.I.F. meet. He enrolled at the University of Southern California and won his frosh numeral, then lettered as a junior and a senior running everything from 440 through the 2-mile.

He began his teaching career at Pacific Lodge Boys' Home in Woodland Hills as a house father and coach and then was at Hollenback Jr. High in 1929-30. He spent a short time at Roosevelt High, coaching tennis, and then went to San Fernando High as track and Bee football coach for nine years. Among his proteges there were hurdlers Walt Smith and Johnny Welker and pole vaulter John Sanders (now principal at Hamilton High and Schurr's successor on the State C.I.F. Executive Council). During that time he was elected mayor of San Fernando, too.

After brief stints as registrar and boys' vice-principal at San Fernando, he became principal at Hollenback in 1955, then transferred to Birmingham High in that same year and to Granada Hills High in 1960. As a member of the L.A. City Schools' Athletic Policy Determining Committee for the past 10 years, he has served as president of that group, president of the CIF Executive Council, and president of the Los Angeles City High School Principals' Association.

His designation as Honorary Referee of this year's State C.I.F. Meet, which is being hosted by the Los Angeles City Schools, could not be more appropriate!

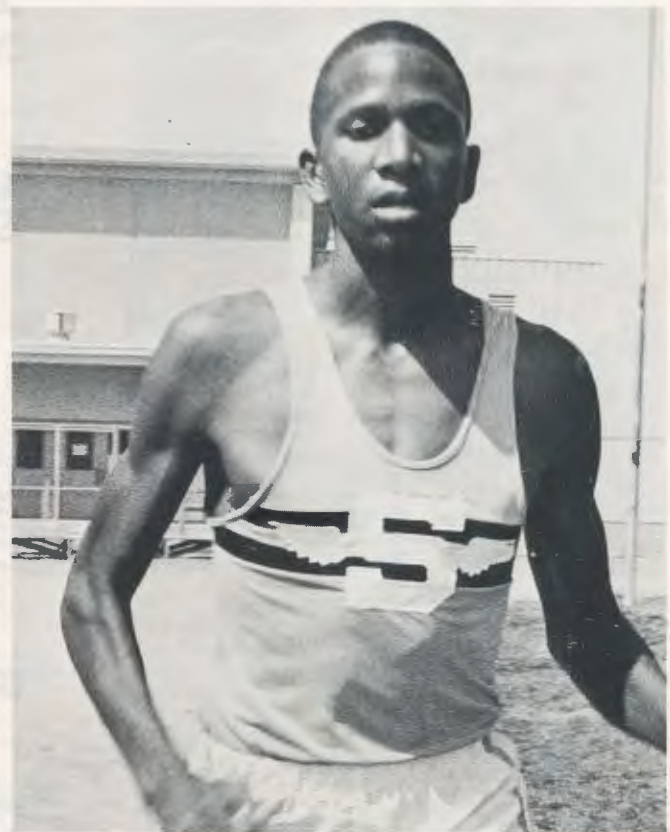
