Meet California's "Dreamer and Doer" Lisa Patterson

The fact that the late Walt Disney was a "dreamer and doer" is hardly a secret to anyone who has visited Disneyland. The Magic Kingdom is filled with Disney's ideas, innovations and dreams, but none of it came without hard work, courage and a confidence that overcame overwhelming adversity. He was told again and again that the project, the building of Disneyland, was doomed for failure. But he never gave up, following his dream every step of the way, and the final result was that Disneyland became a tremendous global success.

Success stories like Walt Disney's are recognized each year with the selection of the 49 Walt Disney World "Dreamers and Doers". The program acknowledges individuals who demonstrate the 4 C's - Curiosity, Confidence, Courage and Constancy - characteristics so revered by Walt Disney. Each year one junior from each state is selected. They serve as role models and spokespersons for the values of activity programs and serve as co-chairpersons for National High School Activities Week. In addition, each "Dreamer and Doer" gets to spend three days at Walt Disney World, Florida.

The 1991-92 California "Dreamer and Doer" is **Lisa Patterson**, from Serrano High School in Phelan. Like Walt Disney, Patterson has demonstrated innate curiosity, and a tremendous amount of courage, confidence and constancy.

Patterson was born in Wrightwood to Virginia and Eugene Patterson. Her father passed away when she was 12, but her mother remains close. Lisa describes her as one of her best friends. Virginia Patterson teaches accounting, typing and computer skills classes at Serrano High.

Lisa first became active in activities in the seventh grade, participating in student government, cheerleading and volleyball.

"Activities have helped me grow and learn about myself," Patterson said.

As a Christmas present during seventh grade, she received skiing

lessons and that has become a favorite hobby since.

In addition to her success in volleyball, where she captained her team to a CIF/Reebok Southern Section playoff berth this season and was team MVP her junior year, Lisa is an accomplished skier qualifying for the Junior JII Olympics in 1990 and 1991.

Community service is another area that Lisa enjoys. She helped organize Mountaineer Days, which is a carnival held in Wrightwood during the summer and has spent time on blood drives and food baskets for the needy during Thanksgiving and Christmas.

In addition, Patterson was involved in a mission to the jungles of Taman where, with her church group, she built benches and painted churches for the communities of Taman.

She is currently the treasurer for the Future Business Leaders of America and was instrumental in a membership drive that increased membership in the organization by more than 10 percent.

This past June she was crowned as Miss Wrightwood 1991. She has competed in Miss Empire America and entered the Miss San Bernardino County Pageant.

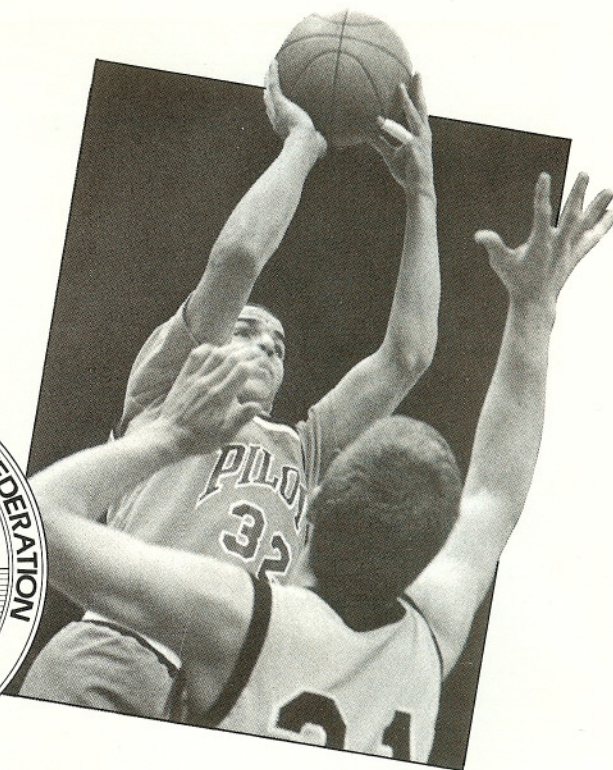
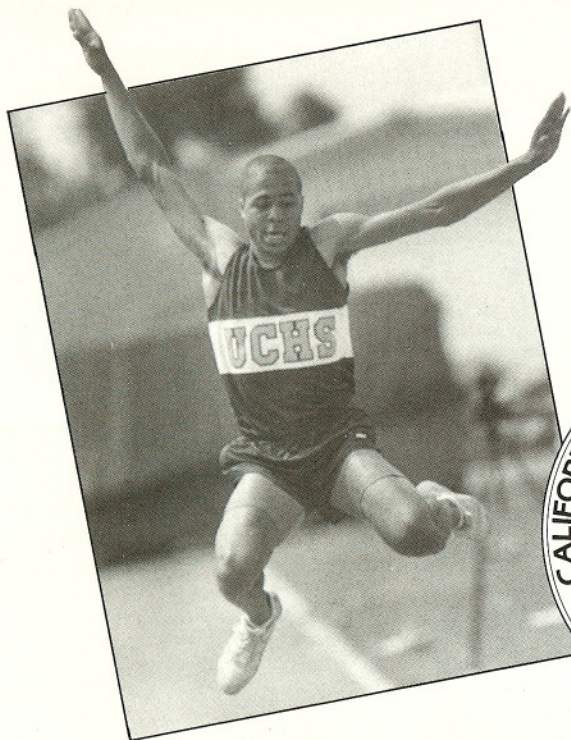

"The CSF (California Scholastic Federation) has given me my seriousness about school work and academics, while receiving a varsity letter has given me pride and spirit in my school."

Patterson would like to enter into the medical field of study, perhaps in research, when she graduates from Serrano this June. She is interested in attending either UC Irvine or UCLA.

For now she will continue to stay involved in activities and "Dream and Do."



A Brief History of the CIF/Reebok State Championships

The CIF offers state championships in six different sports; cross country, girls' volleyball, wrestling, basketball, track and field and golf.

Track and field, the longest running state championship, was run for the first time at Fresno High in 1915 and reached the 73rd year mark during the 1991 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships. Except for the war years from 1941-45, the track and field championships have been held annually.

Early championships were conducted at high schools, YMCA's, universities and fair sites including: the Sacramento Fair in 1918, the San Bernardino Fair of 1919, the Bakersfield Fair in 1920 and the Stockton Fair in 1922. The 1991 CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships marked the fourth consecutive year that Cerritos College, Norwalk was the host site. 1974 featured the first year of girls' competition in the CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships with the setting at Memorial Stadium, Bakersfield.

Accomplished athletes in various sports dot the list of California High School competitors in the track and field state championships. Names like Dwight Stones, an Olympic medalist in the high jump, Rafer Johnson, a Gold Medalist in the decathlon, and Sherri Howard, an Olympian in the 4 X 400 highlight the list.

Track and field stars from California High

schools have gone on to succeed in other sports as well. Bobby Bonds of Polytechnic High in Riverside, who later became a major league baseball star, and Lynn Swann from Serra High in San Mateo, whose success came in professional football, were both state champions in the long jump - a feat Swann accomplished on two occasions (1969-70).

After track and field, the CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships were established in 1916 and were held until 1928. The first state basketball championship was played between Whittier High and Berkeley High at Whittier High School on March 25, 1916. The final result: Whittier 31-20. In 1989, Glendora High standout Tracy Murray set a record for most points scored with a phenomenal 64 - more than Berkeley and Whittier combined in the first title tilt. Women's basketball joined the state championships in 1981 when the championships were renewed for both boys and girls.

In its short history, the Girls' CIF/Reebok State Basketball Championships have experienced tremendous success with names like national record-holder Cheryl Miller, Lisa Leslie, Tanda Rucker and Kate Paye playing starring roles. Point Loma's four state championships (1984 Division II; 1985-87 Division I) have also highlighted girl's competition. Menlo School of Atherton, with three straight titles in Division V (1989-91), could challenge Point Loma's mark this sea-

son.

On the boys' side, Stockton High dominated early play winning four championships in the 1920's (1922-23, 1925, 1928). Crenshaw High equalled that dominance in the modern championship, winning four titles in the 1980's (1983, 1985-86, 1989). Besides Murray, great names like Michael Manning, Jason Kidd, Shon Tarver and Ed O'Bannon have participated in the state finals.

The CIF/Reebok Basketball Championships have come a long way since its beginning at Whittier High in 1916. The 1990 championships marked the first time that all five boys' and girls' Divisions (I, II, III, IV and V) were housed under the same roof - the Oakland Coliseum. Attendance for the two-day championships have eclipsed the 20,000 mark in each of the last two seasons.

The CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships were established in 1973 and conducted at Cal State Hayward. The University of Pacific's Spanos Center has been the host site since 1987. Clovis High dominated during the first years of the championships, winning three consecutive CIF/Reebok State Wrestling Championships from 1974-76 and adding two straight in 1990-91. Clovis West has won three titles (1983-84, 1989) in the 1980's.

Individually, standouts like Jimmy Aguirre, Tony Okada, Zach Cooper and Trent Barnes have competed in championships.

CIF/Reebok Championship History Cont.

With the largest participation of any girls' sport, volleyball has increased its following by leaps and bounds since the first CIF/Reebok State Volleyball Championships in 1978. Highland High, Bakersfield won the first championship, held at Highland High.

In 1981, a Division II classification was added to the championships and a year later a Division III classification was included.

The CIF/Reebok State Volleyball Championships have expanded to a five division format this season and will be conducted at Cal State Fullerton.

The growth of the sport is also evident in terms of revenue. Volleyball has been a self-supporting championship the last two seasons.

Three teams have won three titles in their respective divisions, starting with Mira Costa, which went unbeaten en route to

Division I championships in both 1985 and 1990. Rim of the World has three titles in Division II, while Francis Parker has won three titles in Division III.

Individual standouts include 1990 tournament MVP Tracy Schriber of Corona del Mar, 1990 MVP Piper Hahn of Mira Costa, Bev Oden, Katy Eldrige, Zrinka Kristich and Jenny Evans, among others.

Traditionally, the last CIF/Reebok Regional Championship completed during the course of the school year, the State Golf Championships were established in 1976 for boys and 1977 for girls and ran until 1981. Since then, regional championships have been conducted. Torrey Pines has dominated in the Southern Regionals with four regional championships, while Vintage of Napa has taken three Northern Regional titles. Sharon Barrett, Kim Saiki, Jean Zedlitz

and Kim Cathrein have excelled on the girls side, while stars on the boys field include Craig Sadler, Joe Rasset, and David Games.

The CIF/Reebok Cross Country Championships were the newest edition to the state championship fold in 1987 and have been held annually at Woodward Park, Fresno. Bryan Dameworth and Deena Drossin, both of Agoura High, have won three and two individual state titles respectively. Kira Jorgensen of Rancho Buena Vista won two consecutive individual state championships (1987-88). Palos Verdes girls' have dominated the team championship with three consecutive titles (1987-89). Palos Verdes High was closed last June and was combined with Miraleste and Rolling Hills High into Peninsula High.

A fourth division was added to cross country in 1990.

Star-Studded Extravaganza Marks the 74th CIF/Reebok State Track and Field Championships

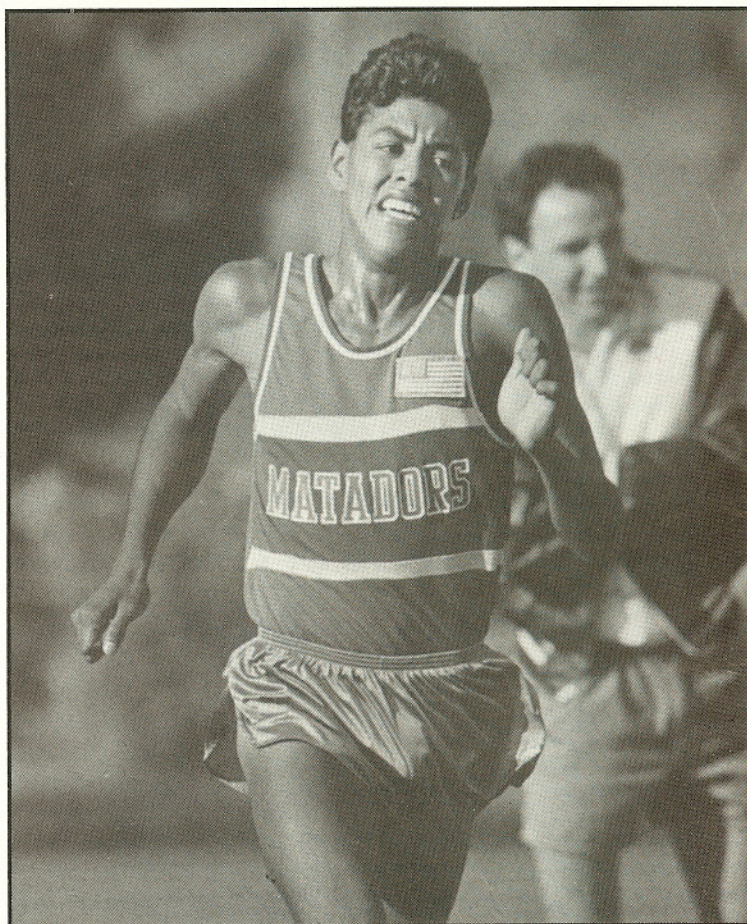

That annual end of spring athletic extravaganza, the 74th CIF/Reebok State High School Track and Field Championships, will once again bring to Cerritos College an outstanding group of teams and individual stars. The championships action will have its usual very high level of intensity and quality, with a series of performances by many athletes and teams during the last couple of weekends in qualifying setting the stage for some great confrontations. The first lady of the sport, 1991 Track & Field News Female Prep Athlete of the Year, Marion Jones (Thousand Oaks), set the tone for action here with a National Interscholastic and U.S. Junior (age 19 and under) 200 Meter record of 22.67 during the CIF Southern Section/Reebok qualifying process. More than 10,000 pairs of eyes will be on Marion and others in Saturday's Finals, with interesting team contests spicing the individual match-ups.

On the boys' side, the team picture became jumbled when the big favorite, Mt. Pleasant (San Jose), with easily the state's best 4x100m relay team (41.15), could not get the baton around successfully in Section action. The CIF Central Coast Section/Reebok power still has Richard Dupree (21.32w 200m-46.72 400m) anchoring a very capable 4x400m relay team, with possible Terry Fulton hurdle points. Vallejo has fine hurdler, Chris Redmond, (14.06w/14.1-37.44), sprinter Ali Evans (10.59.10.46w-21.48/21.38w), and fine relay teams (41.50 and 3:15.0). Merced has fine sprinter, junior Anthony Volson (10.54-10.47w/21.33-21.18w) and middle distance runner Brian Wilkinson (1:51.19 800m/4:11.17 1600m), with Wilkinson entered in the very difficult 800-1600 double.

The girls team struggle is a very interesting one involving a number of strong teams. Thousand Oaks starts the weekend with 20 points (100 and 200 meter wins) from Marion Jones, with 47.31 400m relay and 3:54.33 1600m relay groups that should feature Jones coming from way, way back on the anchor leg in the longer event in Saturday's finals. Strong challengers abound. Morningside will hide from no one, with the Monarchs the relay favorites (400m 45.83-1600m 3:45.86), and the squad having sprinters galore. Santishia Arnold (11.7-24.13w) and Tai-Ne Gibson (11.7-24.47) have teammates Jaronda White (55.73 400m), and Samoma Nickson (12.14 100m-14.44 100mih) capable of points in events other than the 100 and 200. Long Beach Poly has super-frosh Andrea Anderson (11.77 100m-24.11 200m) and Aminah Haddad (11.81 100m-24.16 200m), and 3:47.42 1600m relay team. Out of the North comes Bishop O'Dowd (Oakland), a Bay powerhouse and the nation's best dual meet team with big-meet strength to match. Starting with super sprinters Lisa Parker (11.86w/11.89-23.7w/24.17) and Bisa Grant (11.88w-14.38 100mih) leading a 3:47.29 1600m relay, O'Dowd adds Maya Greene (56.20 400m) and 800 meter favorite Miesha Marzell (2:09.48). The "heads-up" matches of the above squads are obvious, with a great story unfolding before the next two afternoons and evenings are finished.

A couple of events feature match-ups of the titanic variety. The boys 800 meters has a great trio with contrasting strengths. Bryan Woodard (Poly, Long Beach) has run 1:50.48 and is a large runner who exudes power. Tall, thin Milton Hughes (Stagg, Stockton) (1:51.06) bounces down the track very lightly. Mike Katri (Fortuna) (1:51.22) is a CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Division Champion, with a blend of speed and distance runners endurance. Brian Wilkinson (Merced) (1:51.19) is also scheduled here, with nine others in the state under 1:54.0 sure to make the two lap event a true classic. Brazilian native

Daniel Das Neves (Helix, La Mesa) headlines a great boys 1600 at 4:08.63, with Jeff Wilson (Newbury Park) a 60.0 last 400 in his 4:09.75 CIF Southern Section/Reebok win, and Brian Wilkinson (Merced) 4:11.17 an easy winner against all the best in the South except for Das Neves earlier in the year. Others among the nation's best in the event are T.J. Reyes (Lakewood) 4:10.29, Todd Tressler (San Marcos, Santa Barbara) 4:10.70, Goss Lindsey (Peninsula, Rolling Hills Estates) 4:11.58, and Ryan Wilson (Agoura) 4:12.77. In the boys 3200 meters, national leader Angel Martinez (San Gabriel) has run 8:56.99 with Margarito Casillas (Hoover, Glendale) 9:05.79 and Fernando Mendoza (Channel Islands, Oxnard) 9:08.78.

Marion Jones (Thousand Oaks) headlines great girls sprint fields, with the interscholastic 100 meter (11.17 set here last year) and 200 meter (22.67) record holder against a strong group. Long Beach Poly's Andrea Anderson (11.77-24.11) and Aminah Haddad (11.81-24.16), Bishop O'Dowd's Lisa Parker (11.86w/11.89-24.17), Angela Sullivan (Serra, San Diego) (12.01w/12.04-24.56), Tanisha Johns (Burbank Sacramento) (11.84w-24.46w), and the Morningside duo of Santishia Arnold (11.7-24.13w) and Tai-Ne Gibson (11.7-24.47) all have the potential to be considered among the nation's top dozen sprinters before the year is over. Morningside's 400 meter relay best of 45.83 makes them the #10 U.S. Prep team ever. The girls team contest could come down to the 1600m relay, with Morningside (3:45.86), Long

Beach Poly (3:47.42), Bishop O'Dowd (3:47.29), and Thousand Oaks (3:54.33) all projected finalists. The girls 400 event will feature another showdown between last year's champion, Janice Nichols (Bakersfield) 54.6 and runner-up, Allison Dring (Mt. Carmel, San Diego) 55.3, with Tammeria McLin (Eisenhower, Rialto) 55.24 and Arcadia's Asha Jayasinghe 55.63 strong lately.

The boys' sprints will be very interesting, with Anthony Volson (Merced) 10.54/10.47w-21.33/21.18w, Riley Washington (Southwest, San Diego) 10.55-21.59, and West Bakersfield frosh Marques Holliwell (10.62) showing the closeness of the "class of '92" as they finished within .01 at the finish of a mid-season 100 meter showdown at Arcadia, with Holliwell the winner. Add to that group Ali Evans (Vallejo) 10.46w/10.59-21.48, Gentry Bradley (Pius X, Downey) 10.70-21.19, Brian Lewis (Highland, North Highlands) 10.57w-21.36w, Derek Sheppard (Lincoln, San Francisco) 21.24, and Richard Dupree (Mt. Pleasant, San Jose) 21.32w/21.56, and "cooking" sprints are assured. Sheppard handled Dupree 46.68-46.72 in an early season 400 meter showdown, with James Redd (Fontana) 47.29 improving lately. Strong lately in the 400 meter relay have been CIF Sac Joaquin Section/Reebok powers Highlands 41.47 and Vallejo 41.50, suprising Bishop Amat (La Puente) 41.60, and Bakersfield, one of the better passing squads in California history with a 41.61 best and no sprinter under 11.0 for the 100. In the 1600m relay, defending champion Morningside (Inglewood) 3:14.52 will be challenged by St. Mary's (Berkeley) 3:13.19, Vallejo 3:15.0, Foothill (Santa Ana) 3:15.10, and Valley (Sacramento) 3:15.4.

The girls' distance events will be of the usual high quality. Nevada 800 meter transfer Miesha Marzell (Bishop O'Dowd, Oakland) has thrived in the Bay area, racing 2:09.48, with Christie Engesser (Ocean View Huntington Beach) 2:11.50, Kerri Woolheater (Casa Grande, Petaluma) 2:11.71, and suprising Deetra Deer (Crenshaw, L.A.) 2:12.16 strong in Section Finals action. Melanie Hand (Fallbrook) 2:12.1 and frosh Kristi Johnson (Central, Fresno) 2:13.53 show great potential. In the 1600, Nikki Shaw (Fillmore) 4:50.40 and Shelley Taylor (Edison, Huntington Beach) 4:51.98 will renew their rivalry with Milena Glusac (Fallbrook) racing 4:52.60 in the CIF San Diego Section/Reebok Finals. Glusac keeps busy, with the CIF/Reebok State Cross Country Champion doubling back in the 3200 meters and faced with the challenge of a resurging Carrie Garritson (Sunny Hills, Fullerton) 10:28.20, taking down Glusac's 10:31.05 mid-season state leading time. Maribella Aparico (Fillmore) was 10:39.94 last week.

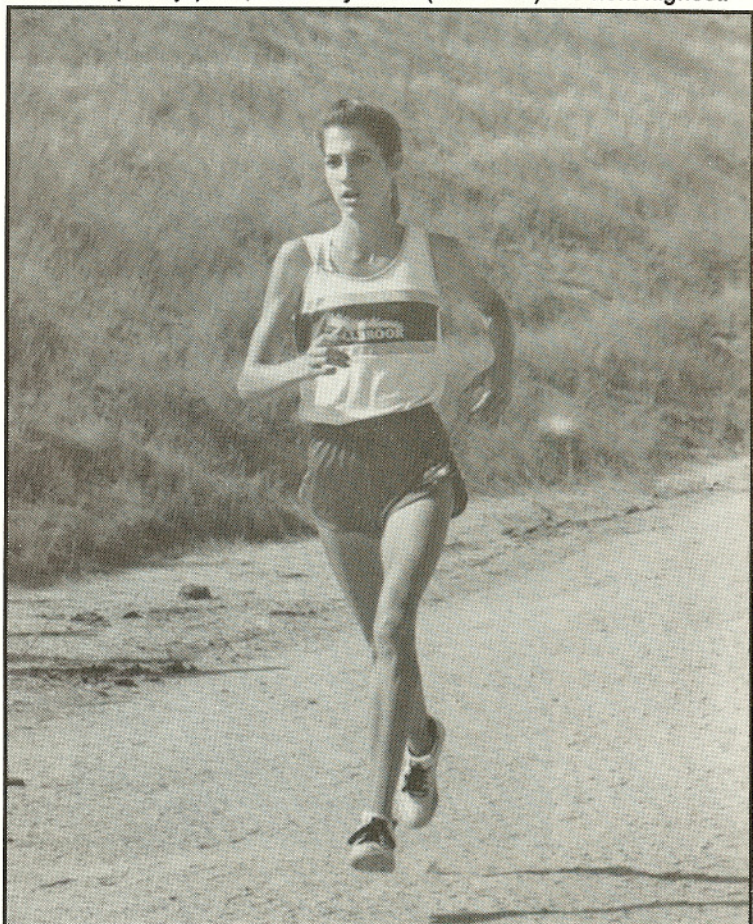
In the girls' hurdles, at the 100 meter distance, consistent Kam Warner (West Bakersfield) 13.94 is the favorite, with Yvonne Scott (Johnson, Sacramento) 13.91w, Tanya Lazar-Lea (Vallejo) 14.00w, and Twila Sims (Lompoc) 14.09 quick lately. Sims (42.86) is undefeated in the 300 lows, with defending champion Erin Blunt (San Pasqual, Escondido) 43.03, Lavinia Henlon (Upland) 43.44, Lazar-Lea 43.76, and Elinor Tolson (Fountain Valley) 43.71 keeping the Lompoc star honest. Chris Redmond (Vallejo) is hot lately in the boys' hurdles, with 14.06w-37.44 Section wins and the motivation as a member of one of the team favorites. Charlie Davidson (Saddleback, Santa Ana) 14.39-37.75, Greg Muniz (Woodbridge, Irvine) 37.72, Kenny Haslip (Muir, Pasadena) 37.83, and Rashid Gayle (Roseville) 37.94 will provide ample competition.

The "Dial Corporation National Male Prep Athlete of the Year," Jeff Buckey (Bakersfield), leads the boys shot put and discus events with 64-8 1/4 and 208-11 bests. Tyson Lingenfelter (Upland) 62-10, Pete Swanson (San Benito, Hollister) 59-8/191-9, Gabriel Torre (Notre Dame, Riverside) 198-1, Tony Mancusco (Newport Harbor) 59-2, and Mark Glock (Nogales, La Puente) 58-11 3/4 will challenge. In the boys pole vault, Clarence Phelps (Christian Brothers, Sacramento) 16-3 is the State's best, with Corey Johnson (El Dorado, Placerville) 15-9, Luis Lino (Liberty, Brentwood) 15-7 1/2, Sean Brown (Terra Linda, San Rafael) 15-7, Travis Calkins (Tamalpais, Mill Valley) 15-6 and soph Scott Slover (Leland, San Jose) 15-6 having cleared lofty heights. male triple jumpers are led by Cary Taylor (Morse, San Diego) 49-8 1/2 (indoors), with Tony Parish (Marina, Huntington Beach) suprising with an improvement to 49-4 1/4 and Leonard Haywood (St. Mary's, Berkeley) also out over 49 feet during Section action. Long jumper

Robert Purdue (Valley, Sacramento) leads the state at 24-3 1/4, and had the best Section Finals mark. Gary Taylor (Morse, San Diego) 24-0, and the CIF Central Coast Section/Reebok duo of Paul Bradford (Carlmont, Belmont) 23-10 and Mike Wright (north Monterey County, Castroville) 23-9 are a bit ahead of the rest of the field. In the boys high jump, Todd Kelly of Big Valley (Beber) has been suprisingly consistent with a 7-0 1/4 best. Kevin Williams (Yuba City) has also been over 7-0, with Jeremy Fisher (Camarillo 6-11 1/2, Brian Davidson (California, San Ramon) 6-11 (indoors), Griffin Childers (Woodland) 6-10 1/4, Alarick Greenberry (Carillo, Lompoc) 6-10, and Eli Gladden (San Lorenzo Valley) 6-10.

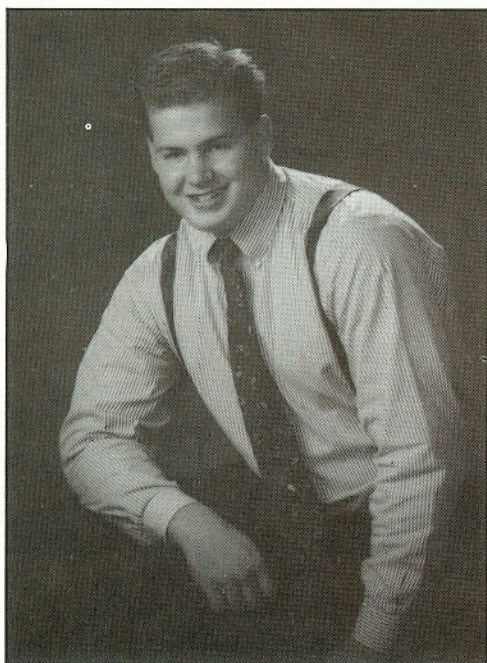
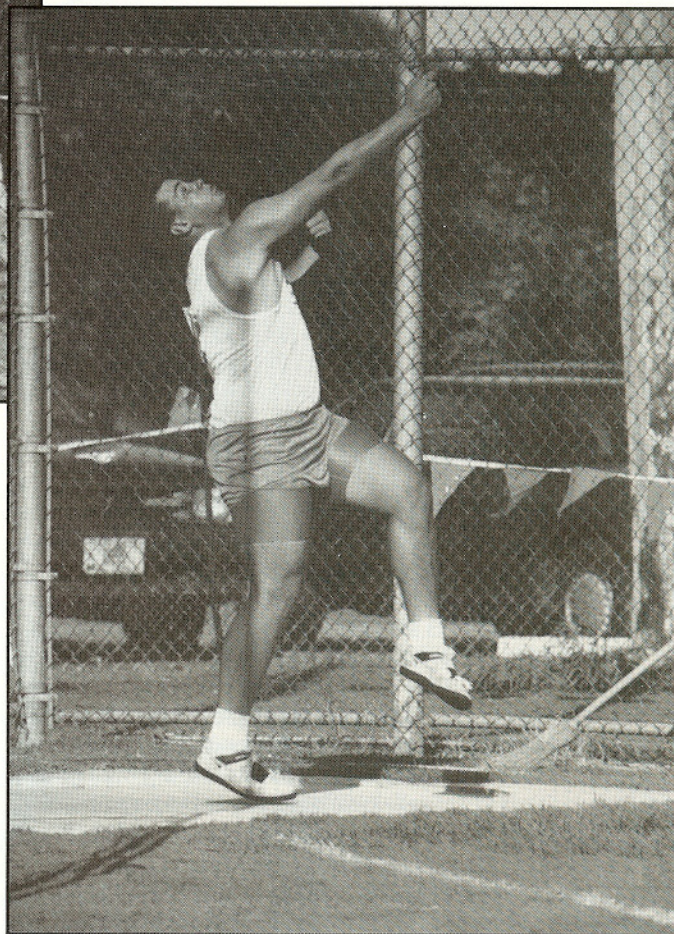
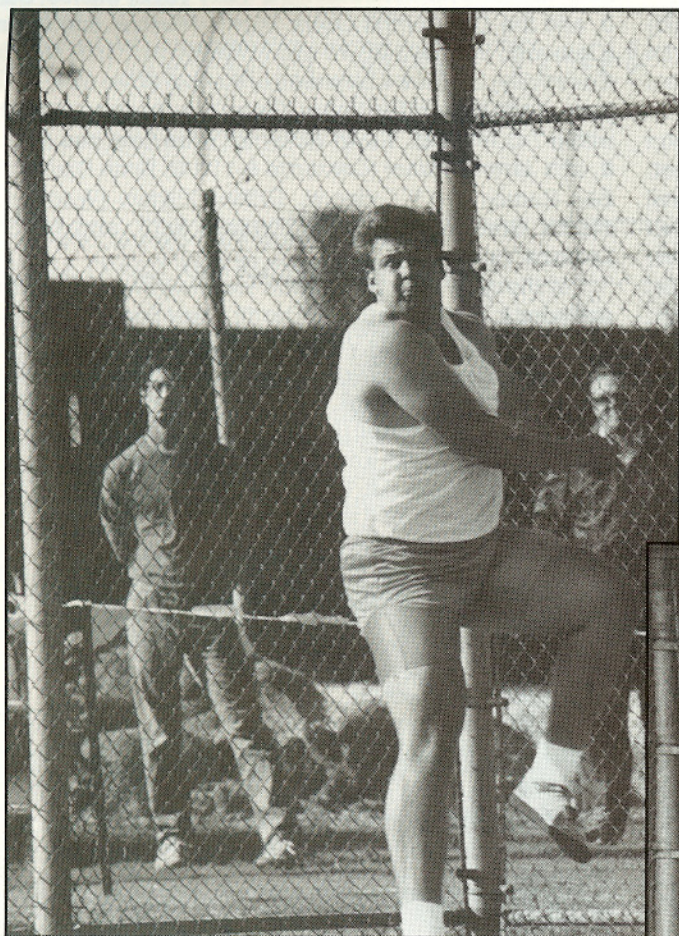
In the girls' shot put, Kristin Heaston (Ygnacio Valley, Concord) exploded to 49-2 1/2 in the CIF North Coast Section/Reebok Finals, with Nada Kavar (Crescenta Valley, La Crescenta) 45-9 1/2, Crystal Brownlee (Westlake, Westlake Village) 44-8 1/2, Lisa Stephaney (Hoover, Fresno) 44-6, and Lisa Misapeka (Temecula Valley) 44-3 a bit ahead of the pack. Soph Suzy Powell (Downey, Modesto) leads the girls discus field with a 157-6 best, with Kristina Mataafa (Orange Glen, Escondido) 151-1, Scia Maumausolo (Mt. Carmel, San Diego) 144-3, and Lisa Stephaney (Hoover, Fresno) 142-6 the next best in the field. Girls state triple jump leader Kayla Montgomery (Clovis West, Fresno) 40-4 showed a lot of heart in qualifying after injury in her Section Meet two weeks back, with consistent Christine Sherwood (Watsonville) 39-1, Ebony Henderson (Bakersfield) 39-1/2, Latasha Burnett (Lynwood) 39-0 1/3, and Amy Littlepage (Mt. Miguel, Spring Valley) 38-8 1/2 battling in what could be a very close competition.

Kam Warner (West Bakersfield) leads the state in the girls long jump at 19-6 1/4 with Heather Sterlin (Mission Viejo) 19-6, Shenna Ferguson (Washington, San Francisco) 19-5 also among the nation's best. Danielle Boswell (Bullard, Fresno) has gone over 5-11 in the girls' high jump, with Julie Jenkins (San Ramon, Danville) 5-10 (indoors), Tanya Lara-Lea (Vallejo) 5-9, and Amy Cheli (Los Altos) 5-9 next highest.



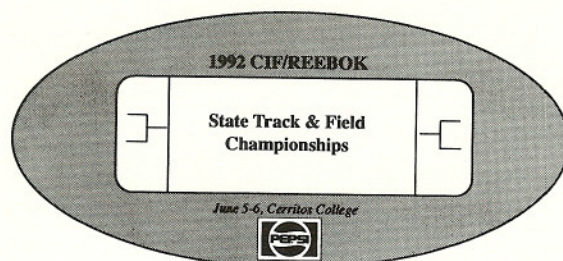

Buckey's Talents Go Well Beyond Track and Field

When Jeff Buckey of Bakersfield High School steps into a discus or shot put ring, people take notice.

It's kind of like Jose Canseco or Mark McGwire of the Oakland A's stepping up to the plate for batting practice; a site to behold.

You watch the projectiles sail higher and farther than they do for most others.

At the very least, opposing throwers watch with envy. Some can only gulp.

Buckey's size (6-5, 300 pounds), strength (he bench presses 400, front squats 480 and clean and jerks 360), technique and work ethic have proved to be a nearly perfect recipe for success in the weight events.

Three weeks ago, he launched the shot 64 feet, 8-1/2 inches, the best mark in the state this season.

It was three feet farther than his previous best and did wonders for his confidence.

"It opened me up," Buckey said of his new mark. "I was kind of like stuck at 60 feet. I finally felt like it clicked. I feel a lot better but now I've got to get my discus going."

As if to prove his 64-8-1/2 was no fluke, Buckey followed with efforts of 61-4, 63-11 and 62-8 in the same meet. "It was the best series of my life," he said.

Buckey's personal coach Scott Semar said he believes Buckey can add as much as five feet to his shot put mark this year by simply improving his release. It was Semar, who has coached three other Bakersfield High athletes to state weight event championships, who told Buckey all along that he would soon leave his 60-foot shot put marks in the dust.

Now, Buckey hopes to see a similar sudden increase in his discus marks.

He won his second straight South Yosemite League championship with a 201-0 throw and returned the next week with a 196-7 mark in the CIF Central Section/Reebok qualifying meet. He returned May 21 with a 201-7 throw to win his second straight CIF Central Section/Reebok championship.

To Buckey, they are decent throws but he knows he is capable of throwing farther.

He already has. He launched the discus 208-11 two months ago at the Arcadia Invitational, the best mark in the nation this season. But even that was still shy of his personal best mark of 210-1 he uncorked his junior year in a league dual meet at West Bakersfield High School.

"I just threw it and it went," Buckey said. "It didn't blow my mind. I knew I could throw that far and it was only a matter of time."

Only two other U.S. high school athletes have ever thrown the discus farther. Kamy Kishmiri of Reno set the national prep record of 224-3 in 1987.

As spectators often say of Canseco and McGwire regarding home runs, Buckey "is due" for a big discus throw and hopes it comes in this

weekend's CIF/Reebok State Championships.

He is almost certain to outdo his mark of 182-4, which was good enough to earn him the CIF/Reebok State championship last year as a junior.

Being one of the nation's premier weight event specialists is only one of the reasons why Buckey was the most highly recruited high school athlete ever in Bakersfield.

A three-year starting lineman for Bakersfield High's football team, Buckey earned All-America recognition by several publications. He was a three-time All-Area selection and was The Bakersfield Californian's All-Area lineman of the year last season. Buckey helped the Drillers to unbeaten seasons his sophomore and junior years. He will play for the Northern California teams in the state's Shrine All-Star Game in July.

Buckey's size, speed (5.1 in the 40-yard dash), agility and 4.0 grade point average made him the subject of intense recruiting from the time he was a sophomore.

The recruiting war got particularly hot after the football season last winter.

"Jeff's pretty focused on anything he sets his mind to," his mother, Maureen, said. "He's committed to be the best he can be. We've never pushed him. He's always wanted (success) for himself. It's a lot of sacrifice to get good grades and be good in sports."

In one three-day span last winter, Buckey was visited at home by Notre Dame coach Lou Holtz, Stanford coach Bill Walsh and Washington coach Don James.

"He's the most talented football player I've ever had," Driller coach Pat Preston said of Buckey.

Buckey accepted a full-ride scholarship to Stanford, where he plans to compete in football and track and study medicine.

While his size and strength don't hurt, Buckey's greatest asset may be his motivation.

And his dedication has not been limited to sports and school. For seven years he has risen before sunrise to deliver newspapers for spending money.

"Jeff's pretty focused on anything he sets his mind to," his mother, Maureen, said. "He's committed to be the best he can be. We've never pushed him. He's always wanted (success) for himself. It's a lot of sacrifice to get good grades and be good in sports."

"I'm just a very goal oriented person," Buckey said. "When I want something, I'll do what I have to do to get it."

Jones Causes Track Fans to Take Trip Down Memory Lane

The uniform may be different this year, but those strides certainly aren't.

Marion Jones has maintained her dominance over the rest of the state's female sprinters this spring even though she transferred from Rio Mesa of Oxnard to Thousand Oaks, even though she's trying to peak three weeks after this week's CIF/Reebok State meet and even though she suffered a broken wrist and dislocated jaw while playing basketball in January.

At last week's CIF Southern Section/Reebok Master's Meet, Jones took the 100 meters in 11.39 seconds -- the No. 2 time in the nation this year behind her own 11.38 -- and won the 200 in 22.78 -- the No. 5 mark on the all-time national list.

This is one young lady, though, who is constantly looking for improvement, so last week's times were a little disappointing to her. She ran her 11.38 the week before her 11.39 at the CIF Southern Section/Reebok divisional championships and also clicked off a 22.67 in the 200 to break her own state and national record of 22.76 that was set last year. Jones, of course, hopes to run her best races of the year not in this week's meet, but at the U.S. Olympic Trials later this month in New Orleans and possibly at the Summer Olympics in Barcelona, Spain.

All of Jones' sizzling times and Olympic possibilities have induced many state meet fans to check their memories and recall any other athletes like her.

Heading into this year's meet, Jones has won four individual titles with her 100-200 sweeps the last two years. Another 100-200 sweep gives her six individual titles and ties her for the most in state history.

Others that have won six individual titles are Bud Houser of Oxnard from 1920-22 in the shot put and discus, Natalie Kaaiawahia of Fullerton from 1980-83 (also in the shot put and discus), Wendy Brown of Woodside from 1982-84 in the long jump, triple jump and high jump and Juliana Yendork of Walnut from 1989-91 in the long jump and triple jump.

Two more 100 and 200 titles next year for Jones would not only break the state record for most individual titles with eight, but it also would tie her with Kaaiawahia as the only athlete to ever win four straight CIF/Reebok State titles in the same event.

If Jones had stayed at Rio Mesa, she would have given that school a chance to win the girls 100 in seven of eight CIF/Reebok State Championship meets. Her sprinting predecessor at Rio Mesa, remember, was Angela Burnham, who took CIF/Reebok State titles in the 100 as a freshman, junior and senior.

Burnham was a great prep sprinter in her own right, but didn't emerge as a potential Olympic athlete. The last California prep track athletes to gain notice as potential Olympians were sisters Sherri and Denean Howard from Kennedy High in Granada Hills in 1980. They helped Kennedy win the 1980 CIF/Reebok State team title and then earned berths on the U.S. Olympic team. They were expected to earn a medal in the Moscow Olympics as part of the U.S. 4x400 relay team, but didn't get to compete due to the U.S.-led boycott of those Games.

Mable Ferguson is the last California prep track athlete to actually win an Olympic medal. She attended Ganesha High in Pomona and competed in the days when girls didn't participate in the CIF/Reebok State Championships. She was part of the U.S. 1600-meter relay team

in the 1972 Olympics in Munich and won a silver medal.

The only California girl to ever win an Olympic gold medal in track while still considered a high school athlete was Evelyn Furttsch of Tustin in 1932. She won her gold in Los Angeles as a member of the U.S. 400-meter relay team.

There hasn't been a boy to go from California high school track stardom to the Olympics in the same year since 1948. That's when Bob Matthias of the San Joaquin Valley town of Tulare stunned the world by winning the decathlon gold medal in London only months after graduating from high school.

Matthias was asked by reporters after winning his gold medal what he would do to celebrate and came up with one of the great quotes of all-time: "Start shaving, I guess."

Should Marion Jones come through and win an Olympic medal later this year in Barcelona, the difference between her and Bob Matthias is that she would still have one year left of high school. And the thought of watching those strides for just one more year couldn't make California prep track fans any happier.

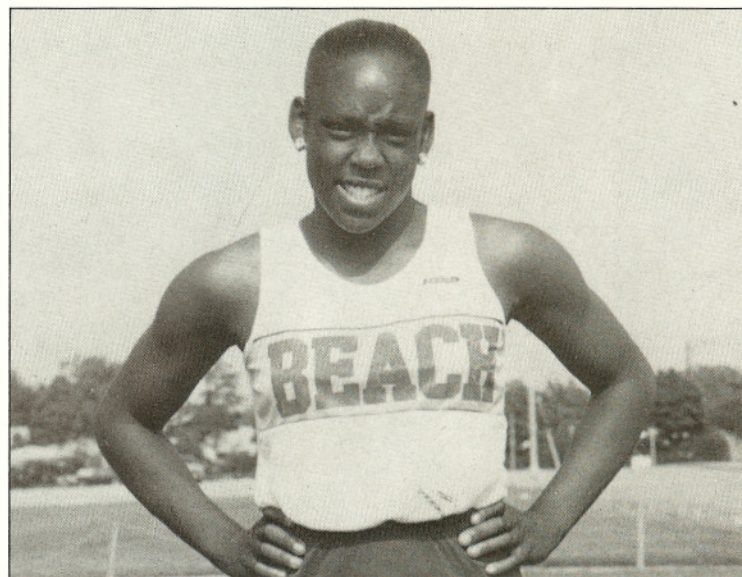

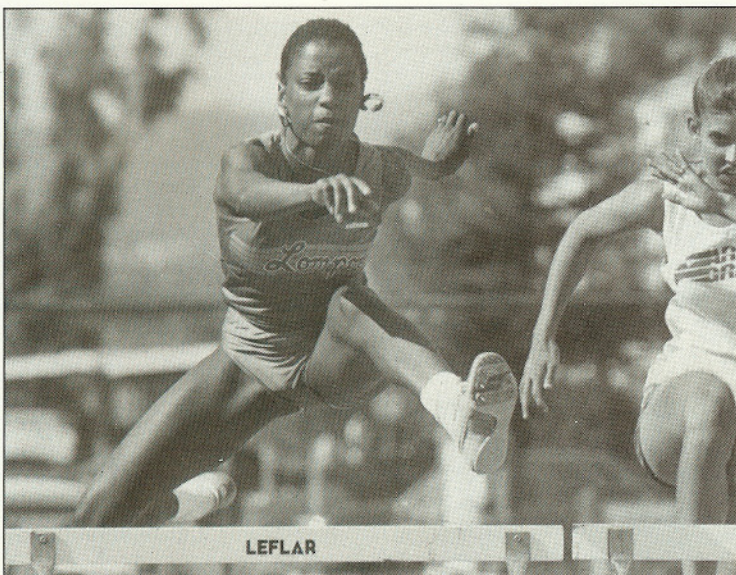

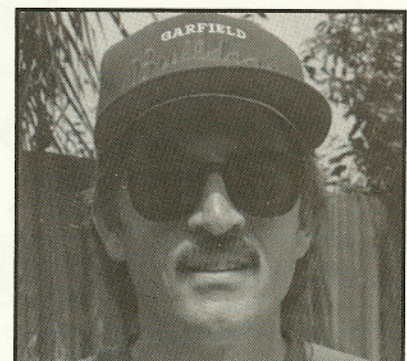
Jesse Davis

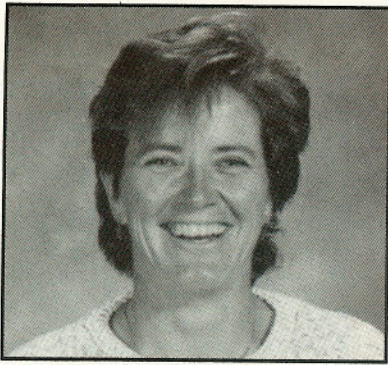

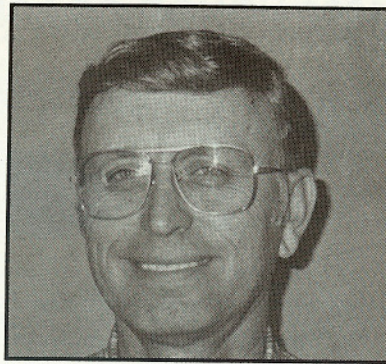

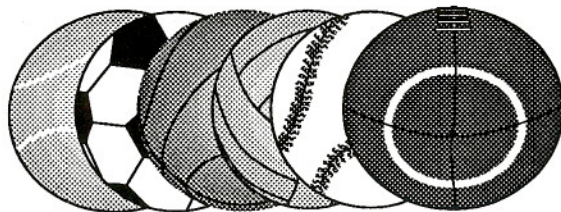
The helicopter will then return for a final flyby pass over the stadium.

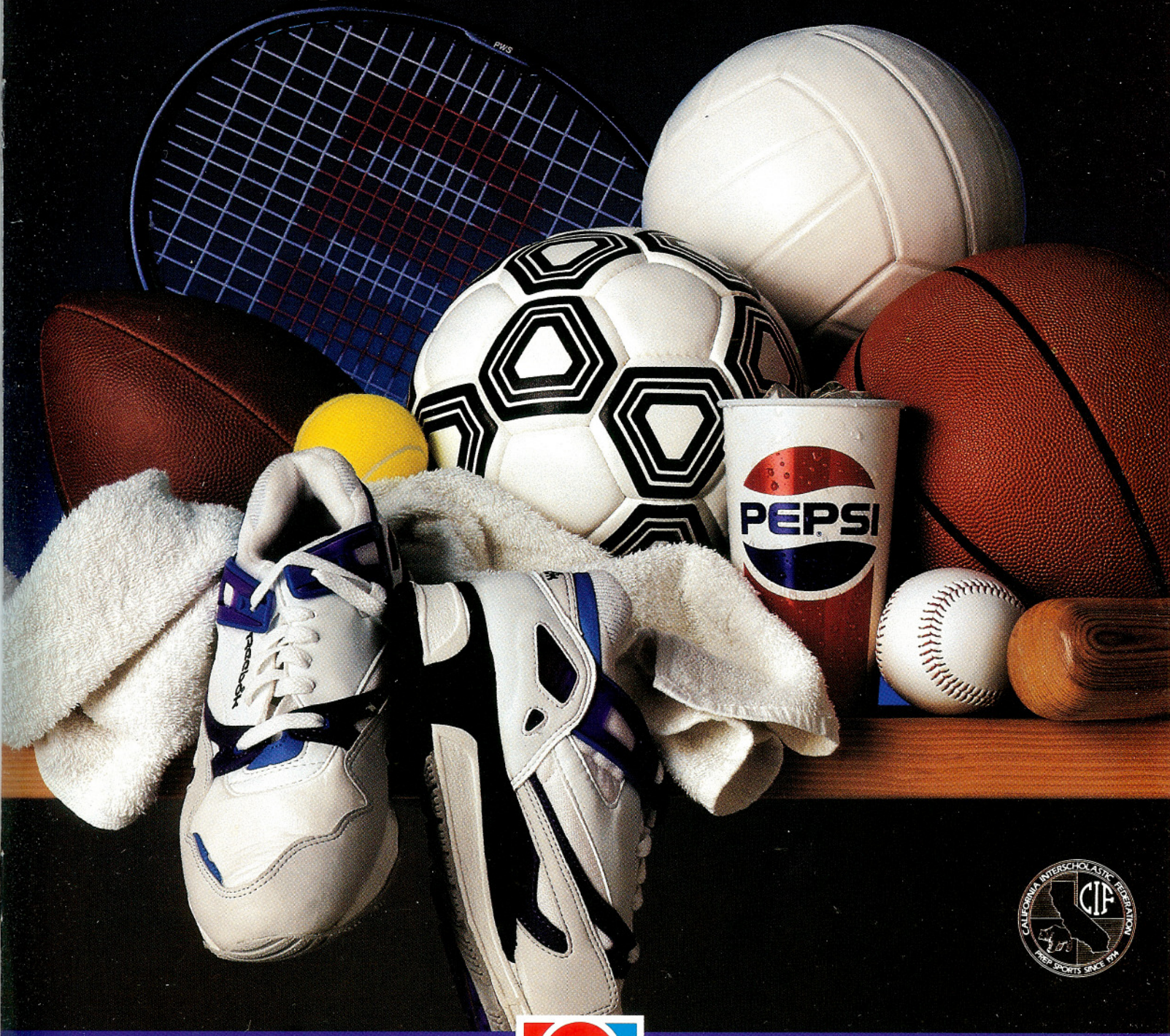

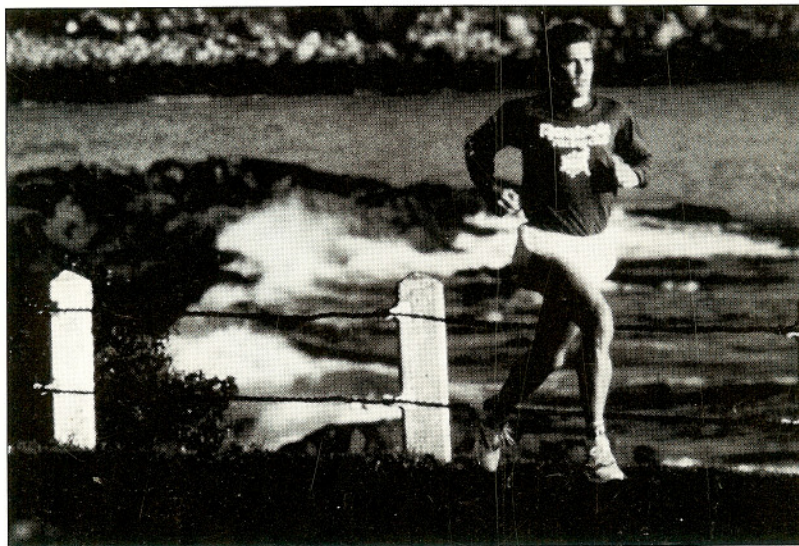
