

#### A PROUD HERITAGE

The CIF enjoys a proud heritage providing quality, equitable athletic competition for its 1.140 member high schools. Since its beginnings in 1914, the California Interscholastic Federation has grown into the largest youth agency in the state, serving more than 500,000 young student-athletes each year who participate in the interscholastic athletic activities of California's secondary schools. A voluntary association of public, private and parochial high schools, the CIF is organized under the direction of local school boards. The elected membership consists of educators who represent 10 geographical areas, or Sections, throughout the state. The State Federated Council is the governing body of the organization and annually elects its officers as well as the members of its Executive Committee. Also represented on the Federated Council are voting members from the State Board of Education, the California School Boards Association, the Association of California School Administrators, California Association of Private School Organizations, California Coaches Association, California State Athletic Directors Association, and the Superintendents Liaison Committee.

#### SUCCESSFULLY MEETING THE CHALLENGE

Before the CIF was formed, high school athletics experienced a multitude of abuses. It was common practice in the early 1900's for athletes to play for more than one high school team, sometimes in the same day. Age restrictions were also non-existent, which resulted in a disparity between athletes and school teams in competition. In general, high school sports ran rampant and many educators saw a need for control. The CIF was charged with the primary responsibility of enforcing rules relating to a student's involvement in athletics and to provide direction to the high school athletic program and make it both educational and constructive.

Additionally, the CIF recognizes outstanding male and female student-athletes from across the state with the highly-visible CIF Scholar-Athlete program, where the best of the best in both athletics and academics compete for the prestigious honor of being selected as the CIF Scholar-Athlete of the Year. One male and one female is chosen each year to represent California's high schools across the state. The two finalists take center stage at the state track and field championships in June and receive a VIP tour of the State Capitol.

The CIF also provides information to schools on health, safety and sportsmanship in a concerted effort to assist coaches education in these important areas.

Highly competitive California State championships are conducted in the sports of girls' volleyball, cross country, wrestling, basketball and track and field with regional competition in the sport of golf. Championship events are



recognized nationally as California athletes excel with record-setting performances. These events are well attended by the public, have aired on major television networks, and provide equal participation opportunities for male and female athletes in the state.

#### TODAY'S ATHLETES, TOMORROW'S LEADERS

The values of sportsmanship, fair play, achieving one's full potential, time management, and working together as a team to reach a common goal are just some of the lessons learned on the athletic facilities of California's high schools. In addition, a myriad of studies show that athletes get higher grades than non-athletes, are more likely to graduate from high school, and are less likely to smoke and become involved in substance abuse than students not involved in athletics.

It's no wonder that California athletes have achieved at all levels. Many of the names are sports legends such as Janet Evans, George Brett, Cheryl Miller, Jason Kidd, Lisa Leslie, Pat Haden, Flo Hyman, Randy Johnson, Marion Jones, Lynn Swann and numerous others. Athletes from the "Golden State" have also been Rhode Scholars, Olympians, and chief executive officers of major California and national corporations.

#### MOVING FORWARD TO MEET FUTURE NEEDS

As a problem solving organization, the CIF retains its original responsibility as a rules enforcing agency, but has expanded its duties to include much more. As the needs of students, coaches, and the entire community change, the CIF will continue to meet these changing demands. In its commitment to educating youngsters for a better tomorrow,

the CIF will work in partnership with the entire community to assure equity and provide the services, opportunities, and leadership necessary to establish and maintain quality high school athletic programs. The CIF will continue to establish statewide corporate sponsors and explore a variety of avenues leading to financial support for its member schools.

#### HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS

\* The first regular meeting of the members of the Federated Council was held at the Shattuck Hotel, Berkeley. (July 4,

1914).

- \* Track and field, the longest running state championship, was held for the first time at Fresno High in 1915. The State Track and Field Championships reached its 75th year in 1993.
- \* The first state basketball championship was played between Whittier High and Berkeley High School on March 25, 1916. The winner: Whittier, 31-20.
- \* The CIF Los Angeles City Section was formed on May 25, 1935, expanding CIF to five sections (currently there are 10 sections which make up the CIF).
- \* Monte Vista High of San Diego edges Clovis, 41-38, for the first-ever CIF State Wrestling team championship at Cal State Hayward (March 6, 1973).
- \* The total number of students who participate in CIF interscholastic programs during the year reaches 1,157,380 in 1991-92.
- \* The Federated Council approves the modification of By-Law 1501 allowing female pole vaulting competition in California (October 1992).
- \* Marie Ishida, principal Carmel High, became the first woman elected President-Elect of the CIF Federated Council (May 8, 1992).
- \* An all-time high of 22,613 people attended the 1992 title games of the CIF State Basketball Championships at the Arco Arena in Sacramento.
- \* The new Arrowhead Pond of Anaheim was designated the site for the 1994 CIF Southern Regional Championships on March 12, 1994. The CIF was the first group to contract for the new facility (April 21, 1992).







Cattolico, with a 4.15 gradepoint average and soon to attend Princeton, excelled in three sports at Leigh High; volleyball, basketball and softball.

Besides being a National Merit Scholarship finalist, Cattolico was a four-time all-leaguer in volleyball and a three-time team MVP. Whatever she was involved in, Cattolico took a leadership role, serving as team captain in volleyball and basketball, freshman class vice president and ASB senator for three years.

In basketball, Cattolico was not only a youth basketball coach, but capped off a brilliant senior season by earning West Valley League MVP honors and guiding her Leigh team to the league championship. She wrapped up team MVP honors as both a junior and senior in basketball and was twice named as an all-league selection.

In addition to being an award winning artist, her non-athletic awards include earning straight "A" honors for all four years and being selected to the homecoming court.

Cattolico's career interests are pre-med and fine arts.

Mobley, with a 4.4 grade point average and soon to attend Stanford, is a water polo/swimming sensation at Campolindo High.

In addition to being a National Merit Scholarship finalist, Mobley was twice an all-American selection in water Polo and in the 200-medley relay as a junior in swimming.

Mobley took a leadership role in both academics and athletics, serving as his sophomore class vice president, athletic commissioner for Campolindo and co-captain for both his water polo and swimming teams.

Mobley was a three-time all-league selection in water polo. In swimming, Mobley led his club to a second place finish in the CIF North Coast Section Championships as a junior and placed eighth in the 100-butterfly event as both a sophomore and junior in the section finals (senior swim season still underway as of publication).

A highly-awarded scholar, Mobley was a Bank of America Achievement Award finalist and a Bausch and Lomb Science Award Recipient. Mobley's career interests are medicine and medical research.

#### A "Golden History" Began In 1914; **Has Spanned 15 Presidents**

Suffice to say, the CIF State Championship history in the state of California is a golden one. For starters, it has spanned the tenure of 15 presidents; Woodrow Wilson, Warren Harding, Calvin Coolidge, Herbert Hoover, Franklin Roosevelt, Harry Truman, Dwight Eisenhower, John Kennedy, Lyndon Johnson, Richard Nixon, Gerald Ford, Jimmy Carter, Ronald Reagan, George Bush and Bill Clinton.

In existence since 1914, the CIF offers state championships in six different sports; cross country, girls' volleyball, wrestling, basketball, track and

field and golf.

Track and field, the longest running state championship, was held for the first time at Fresno High in 1915 and reached its 75th anniversary during the 1993 season. Except for the war years from 1941-45, the track and field championships have been held annually.

Early championships were conducted at high schools, YMCA's, universities and fair sites including: the Sacramento Fair in 1918, the San Bernardino Fair of 1919, the Bakersfield Fair in 1920 and the Stockton Fair in 1922.

The 1993 CIF State Track and Field Championships marked the sixth consecutive year that Cerritos College, Norwalk was the host site. 1974 featured the first year of girls' competition in the CIF State Track and Field Championships with the setting at Memorial Stadium, Bakersfield.

Accomplished athletes in various sports dot the list of California High School competitors in the track and field state championships.

Names like Dwight Stones, an Olympic medalist in the high jump, Rafer Johnson, a Gold Medalist in the decathlon. Marion Jones a national record holder in the 100 meter, 200 meters and a winner of nine individual state titles and Sherri Howard, an Olympian in the 4 X 400 highlight the list.

Track and field stars from California High schools have gone on to succeed in other sports as well. Lynn Swann from Serra High in San Mateo, James Lofton of Washington, Los Angeles and Dokie Williams of El Camino, Oceanside each made a name for themselves in professional football, and were state champions in the long jump. Henry Ellard, of Hoover Fresno and now with the Washington Redskins won the CIF State title in the triple jump in 1979.

After track and field, the CIF State Basketball Championships were established in 1916 and were held until 1928. The first state basketball championship was played between Whittier High and Berkeley High at Whittier High School

on March 25, 1916. The final result: Whittier 31-20. In 1989, Glendora High standout Tracy Murray set a record for most points scored with a phenomenal 64 - more than Berkeley and Whittier combined in the first title tilt. Women's basketball joined the state championships in 1981 when the championships were renewed for both boys and girls.

In its short history, the Girls' CIF State Basketball Championships have experienced tremendous success with names like national record-holder Cheryl Miller, Lisa Leslie, Tanda Rucker, Olympia Scott, Timicha Kirby and Kate Paye playing starring roles. Point Loma's four state championships (1984 Division II; 1985-87 Division I) have also highlighted girl's competition.

The Ladycats of Brea Olinda, with a record six straight appearances, have garnered five titles including the 1994 Division III crown in which they were recognized as national champs by USA Today. Menlo School of Atherton, won three straight titles in Division V (1989-

On the boys' side, Stockton High dominated early play winning four championships in the 1920's (1922-23, 1925,

Crenshaw High equalled that dominance in the modern championship, winning four titles in the 1980's (1983, 1985-86, 1989) before adding back-toback titles in 1992-93. In all, the Cougars have won an unprecedented six state championships.

Besides Murray, great names like Michael Manning, Jason Kidd, Shon Tarver, Ed O'Bannon, Darnell Robinson and Stais Boseman have participated in the state finals.

The CIF Basketball Championships have come a long way since its beginning at Whittier High in 1916. The 1990 championships marked the first time that all five boys' and girls' Divisions (I, II, IV and V) were housed under the same roof - the Oakland Coliseum. Attendance for the two-day championships have eclipsed the 20,000 mark in three of the last four seasons with a record 22,613 at the Arco Arena for the 1992 title games.

The CIF State Wrestling Championships were established in 1973 and conducted at Cal State Hayward. The University of Pacific's Spanos Center has been the host site since 1987. Clovis High dominated during the first years of the championships, winning three consecutive CIF State Wrestling Championships from 1974-76 and then equalled that with a recent three straight 1990-92. Clovis West has won three titles (1983-84, 1989) in the 1980's.

Calvary Chapel of Santa Ana has won the last two state wrestling crowns (1992-93) and look to be dominant in the '90's.

Individually, standouts like Jimmy Aguirre, Tony Okada, Zach Cooper and Trent Barnes have competed in championships.

With the largest participation of any girls' sport, volleyball has increased its following by leaps and bounds since the first CIF State Volleyball Championships in 1978. Highland High, Bakers-

field won the first championship, held at Highland High.

In 1981, a Division II classification was added to the championships and a year later a Division III classification was included.

The CIF State Volleyball Championships expanded to a five division format in 1991 and the result was more spectacular action under one roof.

The growth of the sport is also evident in terms of revenue. Volleyball has been a self-supporting championship the last three seasons.

Corona del Mar is the only school with four titles, winning its fourth this fall against rival Newport Harbor.

Four teams have won three titles in their respective divisions, starting with Mira Costa, which went unbeaten en route to Division I championships in both 1985 and 1990. Rim of the World has three titles in Division II, along with La Habra (1989-91). Francis Parker, San Diego has won three titles in Division III.

Individual standouts include 1992 tournament MVP Rachel Wacholder, 1991 tournament sensation and MVP Jaimie Torromeo of St. Joseph Lakewood, 1990 MVP Tracy Schriber of Corona del Mar, 1989 MVP Piper Hahn of Mira Costa, Bev Oden, Katy Eldrige, Zrinka Kristich, Kristal Atwood and Jenny Evans, among others.

Traditionally, the last CIF Regional Championship completed during the course of the school year, the State Golf Championships were established in 1976 for boys and 1977 for girls and ran until 1981. Since then, regional championships have been conducted. Torrey Pines has dominated in the Southern Regionals with four regional championships, while Vintage of Napa has taken three Northern Regional titles.

Sharon Barrett, Kim Saiki, Jean Zedlitz and Kim Cathrein have excelled on the girls side, while stars on the boys field include Craig Sadler, Joe Rassett, and David Games.

The CIF Cross Country Championships were the newest edition to the state championship fold in 1987 and have been held annually at Woodward Park, Fresno.

Bryan Dameworth and Deena Drossin, both of Agoura High, have won three and two individual state titles respectively.

Jeff Wilson of Newbury Park (1990-91) and Kira Jorgensen of Rancho Buena Vista won two consecutive individual state championships (1987-88). Milena Glusac of Fallbrook broke the Girls Division I record in 1991 with a time of 17:13, then proceeded to add her second title in 1992 (17:14).

Scott Hempel of Walnut and Carrie Garritson of Rim of the World and Buena Park have also won two individual titles.

Palos Verdes, Agoura and Newport Harbor have dominated the girls' team championship with three titles apiece. Palos Verdes won consecutive titles (1987-89) before the school was combined with Miraleste and Rolling Hills High into Peninsula High.

Agoura girls have won three straight (1990-92) in Division I. Newport Harbor's titles have come in 1987 and 1988 in Division II and 1991 in Division III.

The most dominant boys' teams have been Hart and McFarland High's. Hart has won three consecutive titles (1990-92) in Division I. McFarland won the first-ever Division III crown in 1987 and then took the Division IV title in both 1992 and 1993.

A fourth division was added to cross country in 1990.

#### It's Been 40 Years Since the Great Track and Field Championships of 1954

The 1954 CIF State Track and Field Championships were my introduction to statewide high school sports competition. I was just graduating from high school and only went to the meet because my best friend at the time, Richard Miller, was in the 880 representing my school, Nevada Union of Grass Valley.

There were no qualifying heats in Richard's event and he finished next to last among the mass of runners. But I was still glad I went and still think of that 1954 gathering as the best boys' state meet I've seen. I've also been hooked on statewide high school sports ever since.

The 1954 meet is arguably the best state meet ever for boys' competition, and for me is certainly the most memorable. The University of California's Edwards Stadium was the site as 12,000 fans turned out for the one day event on Saturday, May 29. What a show we saw!

I remember the highlight of the meet as the long jump in which Jesse Owens' long-standing national interscholastic record of 24-11 1/4 was smashed by Piedmont's Monte Upshaw, who soared to an electrifying leap of 25-4 1/4. To put that in perspective for the time, consider that the second place finisher had a best of 23-8. But there was much more to the 1954 state meet.

Upshaw also won the 180-yard low hurdles in 19.0 seconds, which was 0.1 off the meet record and edged out a decathlon prospect from Kingsburg by the name of Rafer Johnson. Johnson, the 1960 Olympic decathlon champion, did win in the 120-yard high hurdles in 14.3, which beat Upshaw by a yard.

The most impressive winner of the day, though, was Don Bowden from Lincoln of San Jose in the 880. Bowden, who a few years later would become America's first sub-four minute miler.

won by 25 yards with a time of 1:52.9 while looking like he was jogging. It would have been a national interscholastic record, except that he had run 1:52.3 the week before.

The most anticipated competition of the meet was in the 100 and 220 where defending champion Leamon King of Delano went up against Alameda's James Jackson. Jackson had tied Jesse Owens' national interscholastic record in the 100 with a mark of 9.4 on the same track the week before, but had never beaten King. This time, though, Jackson nipped King in the 100 in 9.6 and also won in the 220 by two vards in 21.2. The third place finisher in both races was no slouch either. He was Santa Ana's Bill Swisshelm, who earlier in the season had set a 180-yard low hurdles national interscholastic record of 18.7.

Jackson also came from three yards back in anchoring Alameda to victory in the 880 yard relay. Leading off for Alameda in that race was Willie Davis, the state's best basketball player of the 1954 season.

With Jackson leading the way,

Alameda won the team title with 19 points while Upshaw gave Piedmont second with his 14 points. King's 10 points were good enough for Delano to finish third. Jackson and Upshaw later developed injury problems, but King went on to a 1956 Olympic gold medal in the 400-meter relay.

The high jump was another interesting event. It was won by Hayward junior Dick Dailey at 6-5 1/2, a good jump for that time. In second place, though, at 6-4, was another junior -- Charley Dumas from Centennial of Compton. Dumas would easily win the event in 1955 and would go on to win the 1956 Olympic high jump gold medal. Earlier in 1956, Dumas also became the world's first seven-foot high jumper.

There was also a college weight discus exhibition event. It was won with a state record toss of 148-2 3/4 by Palo Alto's Rink Babka. He too would go on to Olympic glory, winning a silver medal in the 1960 discus throw. Babka also set a world record in that event during the same year.

Even a prominent football player got into the act as junior Frank Geremia (6-2, 220) from McClatchy of Sacramento, a 1954 Scholastic Magazine All-American end, placed third in the shot put at 56-7 1/2. Geremia later went on to football stardom at Notre Dame.

Cal reaped a bonanza after that 1954 meet as Bowden, Upshaw, King and Dailey all went there. Johnson attended UCLA while Babka chose USC. Dumas also ended up at USC after a stint at Compton College. Jackson went to a junior college and Davis didn't go to college at all.

Altogether, four CIF medalists from the 1954 meet emerged to take five Olympic medals later on. Three of those athletes became Olympic champions. And three of those medals, including two gold, were won just two years later in 1956. Johnson was the only one to win two Olympic medals as a silver in continued on next page

the 1956 decathlon preceded his 1960 gold.

Interestingly, King finished fourth in the 1956 Olympic trials in the 100 meters, so he only qualified for the 400-meter relay. But between the trials and the Olympics, he twice tied the 100 meter world record of 10.1 and in both races beat the eventual Olympic champion, Texan Bobby Morrow.

Let's all hope this year's state meet will be remembered just as fondly 40 years from now. Of course, with the inclusion of the girls' state championship in 1974, even more historical data will be available 40 years from now.

#### **Super Crew Aboard for 1994 State Meet**

The always impressive California State High School Track and Field Championships will feature an especially talented crew of athletes coming to Cerritos Colllege this weekend for what should be one of the finest meets in recent years. All during the season Golden State athletes have "oneupped" each other with action building to what will be an exciting crescendo this weekend. California athletes are at or right near the top of all of the national lists in the different events, with fans privileged once again to see the finest meets of its kind at this level in the entire nation! One all-time prep best has come from the season, with two-time defending state discus Champ, Suzy Powell (Downey, Modesto), throwing a towering 189-7 during May.

Speed is the name of the game in the sport and there will be no shortage this weekend! The CIF Southern Section Inland Empire duo of defending state 100-meter champion Bryan Howard (Canyon Springs, Moreno Valley) (10.43 and 20.76) and Pat Johnson (Redlands) (10.39 and 20.76) are the two quickest dashmen in the country, with more fireworks assured here! Aminah Haddad (Poly, Long Beach), national 200-meter leader at 23.23 and 11.69 for 100m, teammate Andrea Anderson (11.57 and 23.74), and crosstown rival Lakeisha Backus (Wilson, Long Beach) (23.42 200m) are among the top handful of sprinters nationally, with northerners Kelly White (Logan, Union City) (11.87 and 23.80) and Latasha Gilliam (Pittsburg) (23.62) very, very competitive. Failure to provide a wind gauge at the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section Finals probably nullified inclusion of the marks by Ali Evans (Vallejo-10.37 100m) and Willie Jones (Franklin, Stockton-10.44) on the yearly national prep lists, with the duo showing potential off their Section finals runs. Over 200 meters, Evans (21.05w-21.37) and Tony Bray (Kennedy, Sacramento) (21.18w), and Felton Charles (Westmoor, Daly City-21.30) are quick.

When one speaks of team championships, as the sport does have the majority of the events up through the one lap distance 400-meter distance, California has half a

dozen girls' squads among the best in national history, with defending champion Poly (Long Beach), Bishop O'Dowd (Oakland), Wilson (Long Beach), Morningside (Inglewood), Logan (Union City), and Skyline (Oakland) very, very solid. The Southern California squads have each shot themselves in the foot, with Poly's nation's quickest 400m relay team (45.90) dropping the baton, Wilson losing Lakeisha Backus on a 100-meter false start, and Morningside suffering injury and hurdle trial leg disqualification to key team members. Big time efforts by the Poly girls in the sprints and defense of their 1600m relay win should make the Jackrabbits tough to beat. The team aspect gives the "heads-up" contests between the members of these groups special meaning this weekend.

On the boys side, Muir (Pasadena) can make or break its destiny with 41.09 and 3:12.65 relay teams, top hurdler Kenny Haslip (13.94 and 36.65, and super frosh Obea Moore 1:52.91 800 meters (one of the top half dozen frosh time ever run) as solid a team act as there is at the meet. Should the Mustangs falter the boy's contest will be truly as wide open as it has ever been.

The girls 400 meters has Latasha Gilliam (Pittsburg) (54.28) and Jaronda

White (Morningside, Inglewood) (54.41) ranked 2-3 nationally, with Lana Garner (Morse, San Diego-55.22), Malika Edmonson (St. Bernard, Playa del Rey-55.40), and Angela Harris (Skyline, Oakland), the state 300m hurdles champ also picking this event individually.

James Davis (Wood, Vacaville) (47.10) leads a solid boys' one lap group, with Jere Miller (Patrick Henry, San Diego) (47.41), James Davis (Burroughs, Ridgecrest) (47.45), Mike Russell (Rowland, Rowland Heights) (47.33 1993), fine soph Felton Charles (Westmoore, Daly City-47.73), and Andre De Saussure (Taft, Woodland Hills) (47.77) all capable of sub-47.0.

Michael Granville (Bell Gardens) continues to amaze, with the soph blasting a solo 1:48.98 800 meters in the CIF Southern Section Divisional Finals two weeks ago. Breaking the old national soph record by nearly two seconds, Granville will still have to face a resurging defending state champion, Vondre Armour (Bakersfield-1:51.17) and Aaron Richberg (Logan, Union City),

who recorded the nation's #2 time of the year (1:50.34) in the CIF North Coast Finals. Jessie Camp (El Capitan, Lakeside) looked strong in a 1:51.96 Section finals run.

Kristie Johnston (Central, Fresno) (2:12.18) has comfortably turned back all challengers during statewide travels this spring, with 1993 state finalist at 400 meters, Tiffany Roberts (Carondelet, Concord) (2:12.90), moving up in distance in fine style. Ashley Monahan (Amador Valley, Pleasanton-2:12.96), steadily improving Julie Koudelka (Edison, Huntington Beach-2:12.99), and 1993 third placer here, Sherron Rhetta (Poly, Long Beach) (2:11.68 1993) will make it a good race.

Mehbrahtom Keflezighi (San Diego) has become the nation's top distance runner, with a 4:06.15 1600m in the Section Finals to go along with an earlier 8:51.8 nation-leading 3200. Keflezighi's attempted 1600/3200 distance double win here has only been pulled off by one other athlete, Roman Gomez (Belmont, L.A.) in 1984 and 1985. A strong group will challenge, with Mark Hauser (St. Augustine, San Diego-4:09.46), Brett Strahan (Hart, Newhall-4:09.71), and Eric Dunn (Arroyo Grande-4:11.78) chasing the San Diego High star with their best times in a big Arcadia/Foot Locker 1600 contest. Over eight laps, Jaime Martinez (Orange-9:06.08) and Antonio Arce (Palmdale-9:09.21) will lead a fresh pack after Keflezighi has gone through Friday's 1600m qualifying and a tough Saturday finals at four laps.

Elisa Riedy (Mission San Jose, Fremont-4:45.7) has emerged as the nation's quickest four-lapper as of late, with sister Lori (4:57.9) and Claire Becker (Bonita Vista, Chula Vista-4:56.85) leading the rest of the pack. Over eight laps one of the very special young ladies of the sport, frosh Julia Stamps (Rincon Valley JHS, Santa Rosa), the first U.S. finisher in the World Junior (under age 20) Cross Country Championships early this spring, has the nation's #3 time outdoors at 10:28.49. Carrie Garritson (Buena Park) has a 10:28.21 lifetime best, with a desire to go out her senior year as a state champion. Whoever in

the pack decides to join the front duo should be along for a quick time, with multi-sport star, Amy Haase (San Dieguito, Encinitas-10:51.41) looking ready for big improvement with competition.

The boys' hurdles will be very, very competitive. Ken Haslip (Muir, Pasadena 13.94 and 36.65) leads the nation in the long event, with his last weekend high hurdles conqueror, Jason Medearis (Hart, Newhall) (14.12 and 36.80), Larry Parker (Bakersfield-14.20), and Coke Edmon (Bellarmine, San Jose-37.25) trying to beat Haslip and have his Mustang teammates team title hopes dim.

In the girls' 100-meter hurdles, fine frosh Davetta Shepard (Kennedy, Richmond-13.85w) has emerged with victories over Bisa Grant (Bishop O'Dowd, Oakland-14.15), with Joanna Hayes (North, Riverside-14.34) and 93 third placer Miesha McKelvey (Gahr, Cerritos-14.37) also strong. Defending state champ over the 300-meter barriers, Anglea Harris (Skyline, Oakland-42.33), surprising Keisha Griffis (Washington, L.A.-43.59), and Felicia Johnson (Merced-43.76) quick Section finals runs.

The girls relay events will feature the nation's quickest groups. The team contest could boil down to how teams carry the baton in these contests, with a possible scenario two or three teams in the final event of the evening, the 1600m relay contest, with the outcome deciding the team championship. Wilson (Long Beach-46.16), Skyline (Oakland-46.19), and Morningside (Inglewood-46.74) are among the nation's top half-dozen teams, with Poly (Long Beach)-3:42.58), Morningsdie (3:43.71) and Skyline (3:44.15) one-two-three nationally.

On the boys' side in the relays, Muir (Pasadena) has run 41.09 and 3:12.65, with the Mustangs upset by steadily improving Morningside (Inglewood-41.09) last week in the short baton event. El Camino (Oceanside) exhibited brilliant stick work on the way to a 41.16 last week. Morningside (3:13.45) headlines competition in the four lap race, with ten other teams under 3:18.0 to make this final running event very, very competitive.

Jeremy Fischer (Camarillo) has put together a super season of high jumping, sailing 7-4 for the #2 prep jump in California history. Art Lloyd (Eisenhower, Rialto 7-2) has been good competition all season long, with Erik Nyberg (Mt. Whitney, Visalia) also over 7-0 two weeks ago in the CIF Central Section meet.

Kristy Kierulff (Esperanza, Anaheim), 1992 state champ, has returned to form at 5-10 3/4, with Tracye Lawyer (Cate, Carpinteria 5-10 in 1993) the winner last year. Kathy Watson (Saugus 5-10) returned from injury

impressively in Southern action.

The boys' pole vault group is a very special one. Scott Slover (Leland, San Jose) is back sharp again, with a recent 17-0 clearance. Foreign exchange student, Esa Sullinen (Burroughs, Burbank) has impressed with a 16-4 3/4 clearance, with Rob Weighall (Highlands, Bakersfield) 16-0 1/2, and Ben Stark (Porterville) 16-0.

Jernae Wright (Logan, Union City) 19-8 1/4 (20-5w) headlines a good girls' long jump field, with Laren Parker (Bakersfield) 19-3, Tara Oettinger (Foothill, Santa Ana) 19-1 3/4 strong.

In the boys' long jump, Jamal Chase (Quartz Hill) is the state's lone wind legal 24-footer still alive, with a 24-2 1/4 Arcadia win against the state's best from April. Tyree Washington (La Sierra, Riverside) was 24-2 1/4w during qualifying, with Fred Jackson (Piedmont) the top Section finals mark at 23-4 3/4.

In the boys triple jump, Von Ware (Rancho Buena Vista, Vista) put together the #8 jump in California prephistory in the CIF San Diego finals with a towering 52-0 effort. Chuck Bishop (Taft) leads the pack back at 49-10. Jamal Chase (Quartz Hill) was 49-3 indoors while defeating Ware, with Reggie Mitchell (Sweetwater, National City) 48-8 3/4 and Reggie Curry (Tustin) 48-7 3/4 strong in the event.

In the girls' "three-hop" event, Michele Reid (Folsom) was 39-10 in the CIF Sac-Joaquin Section finals, and handled the state's best at an Arcadia Invitational showdown earlier in April. Tamieka Porter (Orange Glen, Escondido) is 39-7 1/2, with consistent Amber Roberts (Muir, Pasadena) 38-10 3/4.

In the girls' shot put, Delores Tuimoloau (Channel Islands, Oxnard) is the nation's #2 thrower at 49-2, with Gina Heads (Newport Harbor, Newport Beach) 45-7 and Soozie Shanley (Tulare) 45-6 1/2 among the top ten throwers in the country. Christine Etuale (Jefferson, Daly City) 44-5 1/2 sits just outside the top fifteen nationally off recent improvement.

The boys shot put has a competitve group led by Wade Tift (Newport Harbor, Newport Beach) 61-6, with Chris DeMartini (St. Ignatius, San Francisco)




Triple Threat -- Von Ware of Rancho Buena Vista High looks to win a title in the triple jump. photo by Roberts Photography.

## Californian's Dominate National High School Records in Track and Field

California is truly the "Golden State" when it comes to performances on athletic fields, gyms and other athletic facilities across the state. The National High School Record Book will attest to this. The book is jam-packed with great performances and records by California athletes in a variety of sports.

In the sport of track and field, California athletes are especially well-represented. California girl tracksters hold nine of 17 national records. Marion Jones, who competed at both Rio Mesa Oxnard and Thousand Oaks High in her fabulous high school career, owns two of those records. Jones is the national record setter in the 100 meters (11.14) and in the 200 meters (22.67).


Besides Jones, other California greats who have a place in the national record book include: Denean Howard of Kennedy Granada Hills, who holds the national mark in the 400 meters (52.39); Juliana Yendork from Walnut High, a national record-holder in the triple jump (44-0 1/2); Fullerton Union graduate Natalie Kaaiawhia, who set the national record in the shot put (53-7 3/4) in 1983; Leslie Maxie of Mills High, with a national best 40.18 in the 300-meter low hurdles; and Suzy Powell of Downey Modesto whose discus toss of 179-1 at the Sacramento Meet of Champions this year, bested her own record of 178-6 set at last year's state meet. Powell tossed the discus 178-8 at Arcadia this year as well.

On the team side, Hawthorne girls set the national mark in the 400-meter relay (45.11), and John Muir of Pasadena girls hold the national record in the 1600-meter relay (3:37.69).

Boys track athletes have also fared well nationally, holding six national records and many second and third best marks. Calvin Harrison of North Salinas set a national record of 45.25 in the 400 meters at last year's state meet, which turned out to be the only national track record set for boys during 1993. Charles Mayfield of Muir High, has held onto the national record in the triple jump (52-10 1/2) since 1980. In 1981, Pete Richardson of Berkeley High set the national standard in the 800 meters (1:47.31), while Berkeley High set the national mark in the 1600 meter relay, which was bested by Hawthorne High in 1985 (3:07.40). Lompoc's George Porter holds the national record in the 300-meter hurdles (35.32) and James Stallworth of Tulare set the national mark in the long jump in 1989 at 26-4 3/4.

## Records Tumble When Powell Tosses the Discus

Records have been tumbling ever since Suzy Powell picked up a discus and let it fly.


Believe it or not, the (Modesto) Downey High record-setter was a distance runner when she first became interested in track and field.

With the help of her dad, Mac,

the UCLA-bound senior will not soon be forgotten in California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) sports history. And, with one more lengthy toss, Powell could become the state's second three-time state female discus prep champ.

"I'd like to win state again," she said. "Hopefully, I'll have a good throwing day...something over 180 feet. That would be a nice way to end

my high school career."

Powell, who has competed against some of the top female Olympians in her specialty, has been a favorite for a long time. At the prestigious Arcadia Invitational, she set the national scholastic record with a throw of 178-8, which bettered her own national mark of 178-6 set at last year's state meet. That throw broke the previous best of 176-10 set by three-time state champ Melissa Weis of Bakersfield in 1990.

Her series of 178-8, 160-4, 158-8, 152-3, 159-5 and 177-1 at Arcadia also broke a record, earning her the Athlete of the Meet award. For seven years, previous to Weis, Fullerton's Natalie Kaaiawahia had the best toss ever at 174-9.

"I was real happy with my throw at Arcadia," said Powell. "I had just gotten out of basketball two weeks earlier. We won our section. I sort of did everything this year. I started playing basketball as a fourth grader."

Downey High was a first round NorCal regional casualty in Division I, losing to Monta Vista of Cupertino, 56-33.

"I like both sports, but I've decided to go with track in college," said Powell. "I just felt that I had more of a future in the discus than in dribbling a basketball."

At 5-foot-11, Powell primarily played forward and guard.

"As far as academics, I'm taking all College-prep classes," she said. "After last semester, my GPA was 3.6."

Right now, Powell is heading off to college without a major. It could be biology, but she is also fond of her English Masters class.

"I'd like to win state again. Hopefully I'll have a good throwing day...something over 180 feet. That would be a nice way to end my high school career."

"My dad has been a big influence. He helped me a lot," noted Powell. "He's been my coach since I started, and has sacrificed a lot of things -- as far as work and his personal life is concerned -- in order to train me. Dad pretty much works his schedule around our training. And...I'm really grateful for that."

That includes the rest of the Powell family, too. She has four older brothers and a sister.

"They were all pretty athletic," she said.

It was her dad who suggested to give the discus a try.

"At first track was just something to keep in shape for soccer," Powell recalled. "Out of curiosity my dad talked me into trying it (discus)...and it turned out I was pretty good. It progressed from there. I broke my first age-group record (108-4 1/4). From that point, I set a goal of breaking all the age group and high school records."

Her best is now 189 feet. That occurred at the Modesto Relays. She followed that up with a toss of 188-4 two weekends ago at Merced Junior College.

"I'm still waiting to see if the 189 throw will be accepted," Powell said. "It was out of the international boundary but well within the high school boundaries."

Going into the Arcadia meet, Powell had an open competition best of 180-8 (at the U.S. Junior National Championships). On May 14, at Modesto Relays, Powell found herself competing against Olympians Connie Price-Smith and Lacy Barnes.

"They are pretty much the top woman throwers in the country," Powell said. "That was really exciting for me. There was more adrenalin flowing than the average track meet. I didn't really pick up any pointers. The big thing...was just the experience of competing against the best in the U.S."

Price had a throw of 211 May 21 at the Mobil-Banespa Tournament (San Paulo, Brazil). That was the third best toss behind the winning throw of 216 feet.

At the Arcadia meet, Powell said she was shooting for 185 feet by the time state rolled around. Well, she's right on target with that prediction.

"All it takes is one throw to have a good day," Powell explained. "Sometimes you can have five really bad throws and then one good one on the final one. If I'm having a bad day, it's usually because I'm over rotating in the middle of the ring. Sometimes my left foot isn't planting fast enough to give me enough lift."

She said that she used to wind surf, but that she hasn't had the time recently to go back into the water. Instead, she relaxes by spending time with her friends.

Powell said there "is definitely" an Olympics in her future. "That's my long-term goal."

For now, it's trying to better last year's state meet toss of 178-6 and her own national best of 179-1 at the Sacramento Meet of Champions. She figures to do that with one "good" toss.

#### It's Showdown Time For Howard As He Looks For Titles in 100 and 200 Meters

It's showdown time! Bryan Howard vs. Pat Johnson. Howard left a calling card for his rival buddy (Johnson) at the CIF Southern Section Divisional Championships at Long Beach City College's Veterans Stadium -- "top this" (20.76 200 meters to go along with a 10.43 100 meters set earlier in the season).

On this particular day, Howard, a junior at Canyon Springs High in Moreno Valley, posted faster times in both the 100 (10.5) and 200 than Johnson (10.61 in the Division I 100 and 21.25 in the 200).

"I was making a statement to the state of California and the nation that what I've accomplished this year is not a fluke. It's legit."

A national-laden field found out just how good the Southland duo can be at the Arcadia Invitational. Both Howard and Johnson, a senior at Redlands, broke out of the starting blocks first and were neck-and-neck after the first 50 meters. That was no surprise as Howard set a national record in the 50 (5.69) during the indoor circuit.

However, Jermaine Stafford of Rochester, N.Y. streaked by them at the finish line to claim the race with a 10.46 clocking. Howard was second (10.55) and Johnson third (10.57).

"He (Stafford) just blew right by us," a flabbergasted Howard uttered.

When the 1994 season began, Johnson was an unknown. He quickly grabbed everyone's attention, though.

"Pat's a great runner," Howard said. A torn hip flexor muscle in 1993

had kept Johnson out of the limelight.

"It's going to be interesting," mused

"It's going to be interesting," mused Howard, who is looking into attending USC, UCLA, Arizona State or Ohio State after next year.

"He came a long ways from last year. I couldn't believe it when he beat me at the Inland Empire Championships. I was shocked.

"After getting out of the blocks okay, I just sort of cruised. I remember

feeling a little sluggish, and then he (Johnson) blew by me. Bam! What happened? I asked myself. After the meet, my dad said, 'Don't worry about it. You were running flat-footed, off-stride, with no zip...and you were still in the indoor mode.'"

Howard felt that the bumps and bruises of carrying a football 69 times for 715 yards also played a factor. After playing receiver for a couple of games, Howard was moved to wingback slot after the Cougars' quarterback got hurt.

"I improved every game and towards the end of the season I started being the leading rusher," said Howard. "We went all the way to CIF. My knees were hurting after football."

With world-class times hovering in his future, Howard, who has a 3.0 GPA, said: "It's not worth it to continue playing football. I could rip off a knee. The coach (Jack Fogarty) tried to talk me into playing, but I said no. My future is in track...I'm not looking for a CIF ring. He said: 'I understand.'"

So, Howard will run cross country instead of galloping for an end zone.

"I'm stronger but not as trim as last year," Howard said. "That's why I'll run cross country next year (to get the weight off)."

Away from the track, Howard said that he likes to relax like any normal teenager. "I watch TV, talk a lot on the phone and play video games."

Once he selects a college next year, Howard said he will probably major in sports therapy.

"I want to do something that's sports related," he said. "I want to stay involved with the kids. I was once there...I know how it is to be involved in sports...and, maybe one day I'll work as a head track coach for a university. So, I'm looking forward to college."

He also anchors the Canyon Springs 4 X 100 relay team (best of 41.90). At Veterans Stadium, May 21, the Cougars beat out Esperanza's 42.32 clocking. Howard took the baton to the finish line for a winning 42.15 time.

"We were shocked when we ran the

41.90," noted Howard. "At the time, we were running 43's. And, I didn't expect us to come out and run that fast."

Only Division III champ Morningside (41.29) and Division I champ Muir (41.97) qualified with faster times in the 400 relay going into the divisional championships.

"We're pretty decent," added Howard. "We finished second in the league (Ivy) behind Riverside Poly."

In trying to go faster, a change of shoes didn't help.

"I was running in accelerators (hurdlers sprint shoes) for the 100," he explained.

Johnson prefers Adias Sprint I.

"But they have a saying that they get you more on your toes," explained Howard. "So, I say, Okay, I'll give it a try. It gets me more on my toes but, at the same time, it lowers my knee lift."

He was losing some power in pushing out of the block.

"So, my father (his personal trainer) said 'let's go back to the old ones.' "

Grandpa also opened up his checkbook to reward Bryan's 200 effort, going under 21 seconds. While Johnson checked in at 20.7 for the divisional finals, Howard best this season was 21.32.

"I've been doing a lot of speed work," Howard said, "It's the first time I've done it this year. Basically, I'd been doing base work -- a lot of 400's (something he didn't do last year). Since I've been doing the speed work, it's coming (lowering his time).


He began the speed work on May 17.

"I've just got to work out a couple of flaws in my 100 and 200, and I'll be okay," Howard said. "Write that check, baby!"

Howard explained that his grandfather had been holding a personal check (worth \$500) for more than a year.

"Now, he has to give it to me (for the personal best in the 200). He's been holding it since my freshman year."

Someone said that his pen had run out of ink. Howard said he should borrow one.

# Top Two Girl Pole Vaulters in Nation Compete in Exhibition

Price and Chase First Girls Ever Showcased at State Championships

The top two female pole vaulters in the country will perform in a pole vaulting exhibition on Saturday following the boys' pole vaulting event. The boys' pole vaulting event begins at 3 p.m.

Kingsburg High's Melissa Price, the national leader with a vault of 11-1, will be one of the performers. Also competing will be Jocelyn Chase of Agoura High, whose top vault to date is 10-6.


This marks the first time ever that girls will be showcased in the pole vaulting event at the state championship level.

In the second year that girls were permitted to pole vault in California, overall marks showed skill improvement in the event. The highest mark for a female pole vaulter, according to a survey sent to member schools, was 11-1 by Price. Several girls topped the 9-foot mark.

Girls were allowed to compete on a student team in the pole vault, following the CIF Federated Council's approval of a modification of CIF Bylaw 2701 in 1992.

The purpose of the survey sent to member schools was to ascertain the number of girls pole vaulting, their best marks, and to get additional comments on the event from coaches.

In general, coaches felt positive about the event and the participation opportunities it provides for female vaulters. Many coaches felt the event would grow, but only if it became a scoring event for the girl's team.



#### 1993 State Championships In Review

### Jones Crushes State Mark For Individual Titles

Long Beach Poly Girls Take Second Crown; Merced, North Salinas Share Boys Title

Marion Jones, perhaps the most celebrated female track and field athlete ever from the Golden State, concluded her high school career in grand fashion winning three individual titles and shattering the state mark of six career championships at the 1993 CIF State Track and Field Championships held at Cerritos College on Saturday, June 19.

With championships in the 100 meters, the 200 meters and in the long jump - where she set a state record of 22 1/2 - Jones made it nine individual crowns in her four years at both Rio Mesa Oxnard and Thousand Oak High's. Jones, of course, holds the national record in the 100 and 200 meters.

Four other athletes have amassed six individual titles, including Bud Houser of Oxnard from 1920-22 in the shot put and discus, Natalie Kaaiawahia of Fullerton from 1980-83 in the shot and discus, Wendy Brown of Woodside from 1982-84 in the long jump, triple jump and high jump and Juliana Yendork of Walnut from 1989-91 in the long jump and triple jump.

Jones received a rousing ovation from the 5,300 in attendance as she made a last victory run around the Cerritos College course.

Andrea Anderson and Aminah Haddad of Long Beach Poly High spent most of the day chasing Jones (in both the 100 and 200 meters), but at day's end Long Beach Poly emerged with 56 points en route to its second straight team crown.

Miesha Marzell, who took her second straight title in the 800 meters, Bisa Grant (first in 100 meter hurdles) and Crystal Miles-Threat (third in the 400) lifted Bishop O'Dowd Oakland High to 37 points and a second place finish. Thousand Oaks was third with 30 points.

Long Beach Poly took both the 400 and 1600 relay events on the strength of sprinters Anderson, Haddad and Latasha Prothro. Anderson finished second to Jones in the 100, with Haddad placing third. In the 200, the duo flipflopped with Haddad second and Anderson finishing third.

North Salinas High boys pulled away to win the 1600 relay, the last event of the day, to gain a share of the team title with Merced High. It's the first title for both schools.

Calvin Harrison of North Salinas put on quite a show winning in the 200 meters and the 400 meters, where he set both a state and national record with a time of 45.25. He anchored the North Salinas 1600 relay team. The previous national record in the 400 was 45.5 shared by Anthony Ketchum of Needville, Texas, Roddie Haley of Texarkana, Texas and Deon Minor of Paris, Texas.

Anthony Volsan, who placed third in both the 100 and 200 meters and helped Merced to a first place finish in the 400 meter relay and Brian Wilkinson, a winner in the 1600 meters (4:08.13), were the main cogs for Merced High.

Muir of Pasadena dominated in the hurdles with Kenny Haslip placing first in the 300 meter intermediate

hurdles and Gerald Stamps finishing second in the 110 meter intermediate hurdles. Muir was second in the 400 meter relays and fourth in the 1600 meter relays and ended up third in the team standings with 30 points.

On the day, three state and one national record was set. In addition to Jones' state record in the long jump and Calvin Harrison's state and national record in the 400, Kristin Heaston of Ygnacio Valley High set a standard in the girls shot put with a throw of 52-11 1/2. For Heaston, it was her second straight CIF State title in the shot. The old state record of 52-7 1/2 was set in 1983 by Natalie Kaaiawahia of Fullerton High, who still holds the national record of 53-7 3/4

Other highlights included Milena Glusac's rare double in the 1600 meters and the 3200 meters. The Fallbrook sensation has won five individual titles in two sports during her career, winning back-to-back division I cross country crowns and taking the 3200 meters in 1992. Suzy Powell, of Downey Modesto, also took back-to-back titles in the discus, to join Marzell, Jones, Heaston and Glusac as repeat winners on the girls side.

There was one repeat champion on the boys side as Marina High's Tony Parrish was again the winner in the triple jump. Harrison was the lone two-event boys champion, with his titles in the 200 and 400. Jeff Nadeau of Monroe High dazzled the crowd as he challenged the state high jump mark, falling just short at 7-2.
